Relative to expressing the support of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* for the Department of Public Health and Social Services' celebration of Women's Health week with a selected theme entitled *"Kinemprendi gi Punton Salut Famalao'an gi ya Pasifiku"*, which is translated to "Understanding Women's Health Challenges in the Pacific" and extending a warm *un dangkolo na si yu'us ma'ase* to the women of the island of Guam for the valuable role they play in our society.

## **1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF**

WHEREAS, National Women's Health Week was being initiated in the
dawn of the new millennium by a coalition of public and private organizations
dedicated to raising awareness of women's health issues; and

WHEREAS, from that day forward Women's Health Week has occurred in
the spring with an annual celebration held the week following Mother's Day to
fully recognize the important roles women in our society play in the success of our
island community; and

WHEREAS, Women's Health Week is a celebration of women taking responsibility for their own health through greater knowledge and understanding, in doing so, they also serve our community by passing this knowledge to their children and to the younger generations; and

5 WHEREAS, Guam continues to focus on prenatal smoking cessation as a 6 way to impact prematurity. In 2011, number of women who smoked during the 7 last three months of their pregnancy went from 256 to 229, an 8% decrease; and

8 WHEREAS, fifty percent (50.39%) of pregnant women who gave birth in 9 2011 met the WHO definition of adequate prenatal care (eight or more prenatal 10 visits). Sadly, this was a decrease of 19% from 2010 data; and

WHEREAS, in 2010, 49% of the participants who answered the Guam Behavioral Risk Fact Surveillance System (BRFSS) were women. Approximately 80% of the women reported their general health as good and 75% of the women had some form of health insurance; and

WHEREAS, a Pap smear identifies cervical and/or vaginal cells that are cancerous or could be potentially pre-cancerous. According to the 2010 Guam BRFSS, 67% of the women over the age of 18 had a Pap test within the past three years; and

WHEREAS, a mammography is a specific type of imaging that uses a lowdose x-ray system to examine breasts. It is used to aid in the early detection and diagnosis of breast disease in women. According to the 2010 Guam BRFSS, 64% of women between the ages of 40 to 49 years had a mammogram within the past two years; and

WHEREAS, women of all backgrounds should be encouraged to greatly reduce their risk of common diseases through preventive measures such as healthy lifestyle, by engaging in regular physical activity, eating a nutritious diet, and visiting a healthcare provider to receive regular check-ups, and preventive screenings; and

WHEREAS, disparities exist in the prevalence of disease among women of
different backgrounds, including women with disabilities, and Asian and Pacific
Islander women; and

WHEREAS, as we celebrate the extraordinary progress in women's health,
we recognize that more needs to be done to safeguard the health of women for
generations to come through culturally and linguistically appropriate services.
Women's health remains a priority for families and communities, and our
commitment to keeping women healthy is stronger than ever; and

WHEREAS, Guam Women's Health Week begins some activities starting 14 on May 5, 2012, with a Women's Health Fair at the Micronesia Mall from 10am to 15 2pm, with displays focusing on Women's Health and a Chronic Health Screening 16 with our partners in the community, and so on May 13, 2012, Mother's Day, is the 17 official start of the National Women's Week", and to finalize the week with our 18 First-ever Women's Health Conference on May 19, 2012 and with the theme 19 "Understanding Women's Health Challenges in the Pacific" empowering women 20 to make their health a top priority; and now, therefore, be it 21

RESOLVED, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, commend the Department of Public Health and Social Services for recognizing the valuable services and roles of the women of our island by recognizing Women's Health Week as it is entitled, *"Kinemprendi gi Punton Salut Famalao'an gi ya Pasifiku"*, and extend a warm *Un Dangkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'ase'* for their contributions to the
community of Guam; and be it further

RESOLVED, that Women's Health Week is made possible through the hard work of Department of Public Health and Social Services, Division of Public Health, Chief Public Health Office, Bureau of Family Health and Nursing Services, Department of Public Health & Social Services Employee's Association, Bureau of Community Health Services, Guam Office of Minority Health, Live Healthy Guam, and WestCare for working together in recognizing the women of our society; and be it further
