RELATIVE TO RECOGNIZING THE INVALUABLE ASSISTANCE AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO **GUAM'S DEPARTMENT** LABOR (GDOL) AND THE FUTURE IMPLEMENTATION OF APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS PROVIDED BY MR. ALFRED B. VALLES, STATE DIRECTOR, HAWAII-PACIFIC REGION, U.S. DEPARTMENT **OF** LABOR (U.S. DOL) **OFFICE** APPRENTICESHIP; AND TO STATE GUAM'S MOST SINCERE SI YU'OS MA'ÂSE DANGKULO NA FOR MR. INVALUABLE ASSISTANCE IN CREATING APPRENTICESHIP LAWS LEADING TO GUAM'S RECOGNITION BY THE U.S. DOL RELATIVE TO SUCH PROGRAMS; AND TO EXPRESS THE BEST WISHES OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM ON THE OCCASION OF MR. VALLES' RETIREMENT.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, Mr. Alfred B. Valles is the State Director for the U.S. Department of Labor's (U.S. DOL) Office of Apprenticeship, and is responsible for all U.S. registered apprenticeship programs in the Pacific area; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Valles' office, located in Honolulu, has jurisdiction over Hawaii, Guam, the Republics of Palau and the Marshall Islands, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands, American Samoa, and the Federated States of Micronesia; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Valles is the ideal person to lead an apprenticeship office, having attended the McConnell Aero Technology Institute and obtained subsequent employment with American Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, followed by entering the Arizona Carpenters

1 Apprenticeship Program, sponsored by the United Brotherhood of

2 Carpenters International & Associated General Contractors of America

3 union (UBCI & AGCA), graduating from the program and applying his

4 journeyman skills for several years before becoming a construction

manager in Arizona and Colorado, and later serving in the U.S. Air Force;

WHEREAS, after his military service, Mr. Valles was selected as an Apprenticeship Training Director in Arizona by the UBCI & AGCA, and during his 19-year tenure, created the state's first-ever apprenticeship programs for five different native American Indian tribes, utilizing his native American heritage, in part, to achieve success; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, Mr. Valles was hired by the Hawaii Office of Apprenticeship, U.S. DOL, using his experience, training and multicultural heritage to great advantage in the management of an area including numerous islands and ethnicities across the Pacific Ocean, and beginning his years-long relationship with the Registered Apprenticeship Program in Guam; and

WHEREAS, In 2005, Mr. Valles worked with the GDOL and the Guam Legislature in drafting what is now the Guam Registered Apprenticeship Program, Public Law 28-142, having become law on July 18, 2006 with Governor Felix Camacho's signature, its purpose being to increase the number of highly skilled workers by encouraging employers to hire and train apprentices in highly skilled trades and occupations, authorizing tax credits for certain long term apprenticeship training expenses, and ensuring that apprentices continue to pay income taxes and participate in the economy; and

WHEREAS, In 2005, Mr. Valles and the GDOL began working to have the U.S. DoL designate Guam as a State Apprenticeship Agency, and

were instrumental in development of the draft legislation further
designating GDoL as the Registration Agency; and

WHEREAS, On November 4, 2011, U.S. DOL granted recognition to the Guam Registration Agency within the State Apprenticeship Agency, for Federal purposes related to apprenticeship programs and agreements; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Valles is now working with the Governor of Guam to establish an Apprenticeship Act for Guam, one of his final accomplishments prior to his upcoming, well-deserved retirement in June, 2012; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules, on behalf of *I Mina'trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, does hereby recognize the contributions made to Guam and our people by Mr. Alfred B.

13 Valles of the United States Department of Labor; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules, on behalf of *I Mina' trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, does also acknowledge the many efforts made by the U.S. DOL on behalf of the people of the Pacific islands and the territories of Guam, the CNMI, and American Samoa; the Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republics of Palau and the Marshall Islands; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attests to the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Hilda L.
