Relative to congratulating the Republic of China (Taiwan) on the occasion of the One Hundred First (101<sup>st</sup>) "Double-Tenth National Day"; and to commending the Chinese Community of Guam for their invaluable contributions to Guam, and for their efforts in fostering a closer relationship with the people of Guam.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, on October 4, 2012, the people of Taiwan will celebrate the One
- 4 Hundred First (101st) "Double-Tenth National Day" of the establishment of the
- 5 Republic of China (Taiwan), a day that commemorates the triumph over the Ching
- 6 Dynasty, and the beginning of the Republic of China under the leadership of Dr. Sun
- 7 Yat-Sen; and
- 8 WHEREAS, since 1973, the people of Guam have shared a special Sister-City
- 9 bond with the people of Taipei City that has benefited Guam and Taiwan through its
- 10 cultural exchanges and economic investments; and

WHEREAS, this strong Sister-City relationship, that has lasted for more than three (3) decades, has translated into millions of dollars in investments on Guam, which the people of Guam are grateful for; and

WHEREAS, more than thirty-two thousand (32,000) visitors from Taiwan, following Japan and Korea as the third largest source of tourist to Guam have come to visit Guam last year, fostering the growth of tourism, which is one of Guam's primary industries; and

WHEREAS, prior to 2009, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* has adopted legislative resolutions commending the efforts of Taiwan to promote World Health, and the endorsement of Taiwan to observer status in the World Health Assembly, the supreme governing body of the World Health Organization, as well as to support the inclusion of Taiwan in the United Nation Specialized Agencies, such as the International Civil Aviation Organization and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change minimally as an observer; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2009, Taiwan was invited to take part as an observer in the World Health Assembly, a major breakthrough for Taiwan's persistent campaign for more active participation in international activities; and

WHEREAS, the Chinese Community of Guam, including the United Chinese Association of Guam, the Chinese Chamber of Commerce of Guam, the Confucius Society of Guam, and the Chinese Ladies Association of Guam, continue to be at the forefront of various worthwhile community projects throughout Guam; and the people of Guam are grateful for the generosity the Chinese Community of Guam has extended to the community; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam, both from the government and the private sectors, recognize the continued efforts, determination, commitments and labor that

the various Chinese organizations contribute to Guam and its residents; now therefore, 1 2 be it 3 **RESOLVED,** that I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, 4 on behalf of the people of Guam, congratulate the Republic of China (Taiwan) on the occasion of the One Hundred First (101st) "Double-Tenth National Day"; does 5 6 recognize and commend the Chinese Community of Guam for many invaluable contributions to Guam; and does further extend Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to 7 8 the Chinese Community of Guam for their efforts in fostering a closer relationship 9 with the people of Guam; and be it further RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the 10 11 adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to His Excellency Ma Ying-jeou, President of the Republic of China (Taiwan); to the 12 Honorable Yang Chin-ten, Minister of Foreign Affairs; to the Honorable Jason Yuan, 13 14 Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office in Washington, D.C.; to the Honorable Hau Lung-bin, Mayor of Taipei; to the Honorable Wu Bi-chu, Speaker, 15 16 Taipei City Council; to the Honorable Paul Wang, Director-General, Taipei Economic 17 and Cultural Office in Guam; to Mr. Albert Wu, President of the United Chinese Association of Guam; and to the Honorable Edward J.B.
