RELATIVE TO COMMENDING AND RECOGNIZING THE CAST AND CREW OF MGA DAYO: RESIDENT ALIENS IN THEIR COMPLETION OF THE FILM AND SUCCESS IN THE EIGHTH (8th) CINEMALAYA FILM FESTIVAL IN THE PHILIPPINES AND SECOND (2nd) GUAM INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL. FURTHER SHOWCASING AND FILM GUAM IN THE INTERNATIONAL **FILM** PROPELLING FESTIVAL CIRCUIT, AND PRODUCING A PRODUCT THAT INSTILLS PRIDE WITHIN THE FILIPINO COMMUNITY AND THE ISLAND OF GUAM

WHEREAS, Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens revolves around the story of 3 (three) women: 3 Alex (a local newspaper photographer, gets into a "green card marriage" with her good friend 4 James, a Guam-born Filipino), Miriam (a former member of the Philippine press and now an 5 established Guam journalist, longs to repair a damaged relationship with her American husband) 6 and Ella (a hotel housekeeper for almost 20 years, finds means of sending her 88-year old mother 7 to the Philippines with the uncertainty of coming back) as the island of Guam celebrates this 8 classic American holiday when people count their blessings and give thanks, the lives of the 9 three Filipina immigrants intersect and find themselves at a tug-o-war of sacrifice and 10 significance where they must find their home or must they find it somewhere else; and 11 WHEREAS, the movie is the first movie in Cinemalaya history to be shot outside of the 12 Philippines; the entirety of the movie was shot on the island of Guam; and 13 14 WHEREAS, through Sotomayor-Cena's vision, the movie successfully portrays the migrant Filipino's experience and trials, further shedding light on the often hidden underside of 15 life; which in the end makes it relatable with any person who has experienced the feelings of 16 human alienation and the struggles of balancing identity and assimilation to environment; and 17 WHEREAS, Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens was written and directed by Julius Sotomayor 18

Cena, a University of Guam graduate, Santa Barbara Catholic School teacher and Guam resident
 for more than 17 (seventeen) years; who was awarded the Cinemalaya grant in late 2011; and

WHEREAS, the movie is proudly co-produced by Insights Works, headed by Mr. Mark Joeffrey "Jet" Apostol and Mrs. Monina Apostol, a company with an established clientele for post-production in the Philippines and who took a chance and played a major role with the postproduction of the film; and

WHEREAS, Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens is co-directed by Mr. Randy Alexander Cruz, a
Filipino-Canadian, who first visited Guam days before the production played an integral part
during the pre-production and filming of the movie, also taking on the role of Production
Manager; and

WHEREAS, the three lead roles were held by three wonderfully talented women
spanning from Chicago, the Philippines and our own island; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Sue Prado played Alex, Prado an award-winning actress and a staple in the Filipino Indie Film Industry, made her first U.S. trip to Guam to shoot Mga Dayo and her portrayal of the role was impeccable; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Janela Buhain-Carrera played Miriam, Buhain-Carrera is the local
 actress and Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens is her first big role in acting, her ability to tackle her
 character made her relatable and we look forward to what she is capable of next; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Olga Natividad played Ella, a veteran in the Filipino theatre who is now based out of Chicago, Illinois and continues her craft there; she successfully tells of the struggles and hope that her character quietly holds within; and

WHEREAS, Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens was also helped by Pearlsha Abubakar, Ver

people on Guam and in the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, in trying to recognize the film, the same sentiments that the crew continues to say during their question and answers explains that when Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens is recognized, they address the process and the involvement of the community as a whole and recognize that the film may have their names credited on it but it the island's people, the island's stories and the island's support that helped make the movie and it is simply an honor to represent the Filipino community , Guam and what Guam can do; and

WHEREAS, as Opening Night for the 2nd Guam International Film Festival, they succeed in bringing the film back home and holding it for the island to see in our very own festival; and

RESOLVED, that the Legislature commends and recognizes the case and crew of Mga Dayo: Resident Aliens for their completion of the film, their success in the 8th Annual Cinemalya Film Festival and their debut at home as the Opening Night for the 2nd Guam International Film Festival and for ; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature congratulates Julius Sotomayor-Cena and team for further propelling Guam in the international film festival circuit and producing a product that the Filipino community and Guam has pride in; and be it further

RESOVED, the Legislature congratulates Julius Sotomayor-Cena and Mga Dayo:
 Resident Aliens for winning GIFF's Best Made in the Mariana's Award and The People's
 Choice Award; and be it further
