WHEREAS, Frederick J. Horecky was born in 1952 in Washington, D.C. and is the husband of Mary Lou Horecky. He received his Bachelor of Arts in 1974 from Grinnell College in Grinnell, Iowa with honors in American History and Political Science. He then attended the University of Virginia Graduate Department of Government studying Public Administration, and then the University of Virginia School of Law, where he received his Juris Doctorate in May of 1974; and

WHEREAS, Attorney Horecky was admitted to practice in the United
 States Court of Federal Claims, Supreme Court of Virginia, United States District
 Court of the Eastern District of Virginia, Supreme Court of Guam, Superior Court

of Guam, District Court of Guam and the United States Court of Appeals for the
 Ninth Circuit; and

WHEREAS, Attorney Horecky worked as a Law Clerk in Alexandria, Virginia for Bernstein & Ward, researching and writing memoranda in areas of personal injury and estate law, accounting for an estate and examining a court probate records. Later, he worked for the Law Offices of Robert L. Montague, III where he litigated personal injury, criminal, employment, bankruptcy and domestic cases; and

WHEREAS, Attorney Horecky then worked as the Assistant Attorney 9 General for the Territory of Guam Civil Litigation Division of the Office of the 10 Attorney General from 1979 until 1981. As the Assistant Attorney General of the 11 Civil Litigation Division, he worked on the defense of contract and personal injury 12 claims, injunctive suites, and petitions for judicial review of agency action, 13 represented the government in judicial and administrative proceedings during 14 public employee strike; labor lawsuits; construction contract litigation as the 15 attorney for the Contractors License Board, presentation of federal grant 16 determination appeal, over twenty-five employee adverse action appeals and equal 17 employment opportunity hearings before the Civil Service Commission, as the 18 Chief Negotiator in the Negotiation Skills Seminar conducted by the United States 19 Department of Labor, and participated in Affirmative Action and Equal 20 Employment Opportunity Compliance Workshop; and 21

WHEREAS, after working as the Assistant Attorney General of the Civil Litigation Division, Attorney Horecky worked as an Associate at Ching, Rosenzweig & Boertzel Attorneys at Law, where he was responsible for civil litigation caseload, real-estate litigation, debt collection, commercial litigation, representation of creditors in bankruptcy proceedings, probate of estates,

administrative practice in personnel and regulatory matters and was the consulting 1 attorney for the Guam Memorial Hospital; and 2

WHEREAS, Attorney Horecky was then a general partner of Horecky & 3 Wheeler, A Law Partnership, where his responsibilities included civil and criminal 4 litigation and trial experience in personal injury, real-estate and commercial areas, 5 representation of individuals and business entities before various administrative 6 boards and agencies of the government of Guam, general business and commercial 7 representation and construction litigation and representation of parties in 8 construction and commercial arbitration proceedings before the American 9 Arbitration Association: and 10

WHEREAS, Attorney Horecky is a managing partner at the Law Offices of 11 Horecky and Associates, specializing in real estate and corporate transactions. He 12 has also been serving as counsel to the Guam Public Utilities Commission since 13 September 2008 and as the Administrative Law Judge for Telecommunications and 14 Power matters, a licensed Real Estate Broker and Director of the Guam 15 Association of Realtor, past general counsel to the Guam Power Authority and its 16 Board of Directors; corporate, employment, procurement, and litigation matters, 17 representation and negotiation for the first independent power projects in Guam, 18 drafting and preparation of fuel oil contracts concerning supply of fuel to Guam, 19 general counsel to the Guam Memorial Hospital, negotiated and drafted public-20 private management agreement between GMH and the Consortium (Queens 21 Hospital, Straub, and Kapiolani Hospital), legal counsel to the Guam Board of 22 Accountancy, representation of numerous hotels and businesses seeking qualifying 23 certificates and/or loans before the Guam Economic Development Authority, 24 general corporate representation in business transactions and real estate matters, 25 and obtained Certificate of Training from the Construction Industry Arbitration 26

Training Workshop conducted but the Honolulu Regional Office of the American
 Arbitration Association; and

WHEREAS, among his various obligations as the managing partner of the 3 Law Offices of Horecky & Associates, Attorney Horecky is also the current 4 director and legal counsel of the Chinese Chamber of Commerce of Guam, served 5 as a member of the Guam Election Commission from 1996 until 2000, served as 6 the Chairman of the Election Commission from August 2002 to 2007, has been a 7 member of the Hafa Adai Kiwanis Club since 1980, which included positions as 8 president and Board of Directorship and member of the Toastmasters Club of 9 Guam from 1983-1987; and 10

WHEREAS, Attorney Horecky celebrates his 60th birthday on October 13, 2012, and at the same time, demonstrates his generosity and commitment to improving the community by hosting a party with a purpose, raising money to benefit the University of Guam and Junior Achievement; and
