Relative to recognizing the month of October, 2012, as National Breast Cancer Awareness Month; to honor those individuals who have lost their lives to breast cancer; to celebrate those who have survived the disease; to acknowledge the efforts of Guam Cancer Care and Guam Breast & Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program and their conducting of the "Get Your Pink On" Breast Cancer Awareness Health Fair at the Micronesia Mall on Sunday, October 14, 2012, to increase public awareness, and to pledge to continue to combat this terrible illness.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I 2 MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, President Barack Obama has proclaimed October 2012 to be National Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and to encourage citizens, government agencies, private businesses, nonprofit organizations, and all other interested groups to join in activities that will increase awareness of what Americans can do to prevent breast cancer; and

9 WHEREAS, breast cancer strikes women (and a few men) of all
10 backgrounds, races, ethnicities and ages, and is the leading cause of
11 cancer deaths among all women under the age of 45; and

WHEREAS, breast cancer in young women is more aggressive,
 and any delays in diagnosis and treatment can have serious
 consequences, many of which could be countered by breast cancer
 education and awareness; and

5 WHEREAS, young women faced with breast cancer have 6 unique challenges since they are in their prime childbearing years 7 and may need fertility counseling, family counseling, genetic 8 counseling, and social and psychological support; and

9 WHEREAS, in 2012, the American Cancer Society (ACS) has 10 estimated that there will be about 226,870 new cases of invasive 11 breast cancer in women in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the ACS also estimates that about 63,000 new cases of CIS (carcinoma in situ) will be found, which is the non-invasive, earliest form of breast cancer; and the ACS also estimates that about 39,510 deaths from breast cancer in women will occur in the United States in 2012; and

WHEREAS, older women, and those who have a personal or
family history of breast cancer, are among those at greatest risk of
developing the illness, and early detection is key in the fight against
the disease; and

WHEREAS, screening mammograms can help detect breast cancer in its early stages, and persons of both sexes should speak with their health care providers about this disease to learn more about symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment; and

WHEREAS, Terry Cuabo and Chalorna Frieitas Lauron from
Guam Cancer Care, together with the staff of the Guam Breast &

Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, including Annabelle
 Estrada, Venancio Imanil, Rachel Ramirez, Dr. Suzanne Sison, and
 Roselie Zabala, will be conducting a "Get Your Pink On" Breast
 Cancer Awareness Health Fair at the Center Court of the Micronesia
 Mall from 10 a.m. - 3 p.m. on Sunday, October 14th, 2012, to promote
 increased breast cancer awareness in Guam; and

7 WHEREAS, the Health Fair will feature speakers, provide 8 breast cancer risk assessment tests, blood pressure and glucose tests, 9 schedule mammogram appointments, and give away raffle prizes, 10 including an executive medical check-up in the Philippines, including 11 airfare, and provide free mammograms based on the Early Detection 12 Program's criteria, now, therefore, be it

13 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*,
14 on behalf of the people of Guam, does hereby recognize October,
15 2012, to be National Breast Cancer Awareness Month in Guam; and
16 be it further

17 **RESOLVED**, that women should make an effort this month to 18 see their health care provider about a mammogram if they have not 19 done so recently, because delays in diagnosis and treatment can have 20 serious consequences, many of which could be countered through 21 breast cancer education and awareness; and be it further

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby encourage all residents, businesses, agencies, organizations, groups and individuals to join in activities that will increase awareness of what can be done to prevent breast cancer, such as this Breast Cancer Awareness Health Fair; and be it further
