- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Sinforoso C. Tolentino was born on July 26, 1919 in
- 4 Baguio, Ilocos Sur, Philippines and enjoyed the gift of life until May 21, 2005 in
- 5 Roseville, California. He was the son of the late Eleuterio and Agustine C.

- WHEREAS, he was married to Concepcion Y. Martinez in 1959, to whom
- 8 they had six (6) children, namely Alberto, Clarissa, Nieves, Sinforoso, Angela, and
- 9 Dominica Tolentino. With their children, they were also blessed to have ten (10)
- 10 grandchildren, Tamineh, Brandon, Angela, Kiana, Ana, Annika, Alfred, Kristin,
- 11 Sinforoso, and Akayla; and
- WHEREAS, during the World War II, Dr. Tolentino pursued his studies in
- 13 Medicine at the University of the Philippines in Manila, Philippines, where he

graduated in 1945. He then became a resident physician in Baguio City, Philippines; and WHEREAS, later in his profession, he employed with the Orthopedic Hospital in Manila, which encouraged his interest in orthopedic surgery. In addition, in 1953 to 1958, he became a resident physician at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, specializing in Orthopedics; and WHEREAS, in 1958, Dr. Tolentino arrived on Guam after responding to an adverstisement for an orthopedic doctor for the Guam memorial Hospital. He worked with GMH from 1958 to 1997, then later at the Catholic Medical Center for two years as a consultant; and WHEREAS, later, he opened his private practice from 1960s to 1997, but

WHEREAS, later, he opened his private practice from 1960s to 1997, but continued to work with the Guam Memorial Hospital until his retirement from medicine in 1997, and continued with the Catholic Medical Center as a consultant until its closing; and

WHEREAS, for thirteen years, Dr. Tolentino was the only orthopedic surgeon at the Guam Memorial Hospital, until Dr. Jan Bollinger arrived in 1970s. For several years, the two shared a clinic at the ITC Building in Tamunig; and

WHEREAS, aside from his dedicated services in his medical practice with his clinic and GMH, Dr. Tolentino also participated in the U.S. Selective Service, Department of Health, Crippled Children Services, Department of Corrections Parole Board, and Department of Labor Workers Compensation Commission; and WHEREAS, his excellent skills and knowledge also enabled him to be a part of the Western Pacific Medical Association, American Medical Association, Guam Medical Society, University of the Philippines Medical Alumni Society, Charter Member of the Rotary Club of Tumon Bay, and the Paul Harris

Fellowship; and

1 WHEREAS, Dr. Sinforoso Tolentino has been truly loved by his family, friends and his colleagues as he served the healthcare needs of the people of Guam 2 and that the Guam Medical Society comes together to honor and remember the 3 invaluable services that Dr. Leon L.
