WHEREAS, Dr. Leon L. Concepcion was born in 1919 in Manila, 3 Philippines and enjoyed 68 years of his life. He was married to Orencia 4 Concepcion, whom he had three (3) children with, Noel, Dante, and Emma, to 5 which they have gained additional blessings of six (6) grandchildren, Ian, Joshua 6 and Banks Concepcion, and Thomas, Joseph, and Erin Hoolihan; and 7

WHEREAS, in his academic years, he attended the University of the 8 Philippines to acquire his Bachelor's degree and furthered his education by 9 attending Medical School at the University of Santo Tomas in 1943; and 10

WHEREAS, in 1948, Dr. Concepcion sought opportunities in the United 11 States to gain experience to enhance his knowledge in medicine by training for one 12 year at the Children's Hospital in Boston, Massachusetts. In addition, the following 13

year, Dr. Concepcion also trained at the Contagious Disease Hospital in Worcester,
 Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, around the same year of his training in 1949, Dr. Concepcion also received his Board Certification from the American Board of Pediatrics, which had later provided more opportunities to share his knowledge and skills in the healthcare community; and

WHEREAS, after receiving his board certification, he returned to Manila,
Philippines to practice Pediatrics and became a professor at his alma mater in
University of Santo Tomas. Later, in 1957, he traveled to Los Angeles, California
to participate in a one year Pediatric Hematology Fellowship at the University of
California, Los Angeles (UCLA); and

WHEREAS, in 1961, at the age of 42, he accepted a position at the Guam Memorial Hospital, where he started his medical profession in servicing the healthcare needs of our island community; and

WHEREAS, upon accepting the position in the hospital, he then relocated his wife and children to Guam and became on of the first Filipino doctors who eventually came and stayed on Guam to practice their medical profession. During the latter half of his 25 years of practicing pediatrics on Guam, he built St. Anthony's Clinic and went into private practice; and

WHEREAS, he enjoyed his years on Guam, appreciated the many friendships he had developed with the people in our community, and was very grateful for the trust given to him from the parents of the many patients he had throughout his service; and

WHEREAS, his family, friends and Guam Medical Society comes together to honor and remember the invaluable services that Dr. Leon L. Concepcion has contributed to the healthcare of the people of our island; and now, therefore be it **RESOLVED**, the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Una Na I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, posthumously recognize and commend Dr. Leon L.
