1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN***  
2 ***GUÅHAN*:**

3           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Kenneth Louis Carriveau, Sr., was born on March 24,  
4 1942, in Bay City, Michigan, to his proud parents, Burton Leo and Bertha Helen  
5 Carriveau; and

6           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau is the eldest of three siblings, and has a brother,  
7 Robert Carriveau; and a sister, Sherry Carriveau McDonald; and

1           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau graduated from Holy Ghost Seminary on June 5,  
2 1960; and

3           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau joined the congregation of the Holy Ghost  
4 Fathers, taking simple vows at the novitiate in Ridgefield, Connecticut, on August  
5 22, 1961; and

6           **WHEREAS** after three (3) years, Kenneth left the seminary and attended  
7 Duquesne University, where he met his wife-to-be, Helen Vivian Leon Guerrero,  
8 who was studying Spanish at Duquesne University, after attending Mass one  
9 Sunday at the Duquesne University Chapel; and

10          **WHEREAS**, Carriveau married the love of his life, Helen Vivian Leon  
11 Guerrero, on June 3, 1967, at the Duquesne University Chapel in Pittsburg,  
12 Pennsylvania, where they met; and

13          **WHEREAS**, in 1968, Dr. Carriveau and his beautiful wife moved to Guam,  
14 Helen's home; and

15          **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau and his wife, Helen, had two children: a son,  
16 Kenneth Louis Carriveau, Jr., who is married to Llolanda Gayle Carriveau, and  
17 they have two children, Katherine Luisa and Kieran Lee Carriveau; and a daughter,  
18 Monique Rochelle Carriveau Storie, who is married to Brett Marlan Storie, and  
19 they have a son, Ethan Thomas Storie; and

20          **WHEREAS**, on June 6, 1965, Dr. Carriveau received his Bachelor of Arts  
21 degree in Philosophy and Classical Languages from Duquesne University in  
22 Pittsburg, Pennsylvania; and

23          **WHEREAS**, on August 9, 1966, Dr. Carriveau received his Masters of  
24 Library Science degree from the University of Pittsburg (Pittsburg, Pennsylvania);  
25 and

26          **WHEREAS**, in April 1973, Dr. Carriveau received his Advanced Certificate  
27 in Library Science from the University of Pittsburg (Pittsburg, Pennsylvania); and

1           **WHEREAS**, in December 1975, Dr. Carriveau received his Doctorate of  
2 Philosophy in Educational Communications and Technology from the University  
3 of Pittsburg (Pittsburg, Pennsylvania); and

4           **WHEREAS**, upon his arrival on Guam in 1968, Dr. Carriveau worked as a  
5 Librarian at the University of Guam’s RFK Library; and

6           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau held various faculty and administrative positions  
7 during his twenty-six (26) year tenure at the University of Guam; and

8           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau’s first position at the University of Guam was  
9 Acquisitions Librarian, Dean of Library Services, College of Education, where he  
10 taught Library Science, Audio-Visual Education, and Foundations in Education;  
11 and

12           **WHEREAS**, the WASC had recommended that an institutional research  
13 position was necessary, and then UOG President Jose Cruz asked Dr. Carriveau to  
14 serve as the UOG’s first IR because of his years of service as the University’s  
15 Accreditation Liaison Officer; and

16           **WHEREAS**, as Dean of Library Services, Dr. Carriveau agreed to house a  
17 telecommunications project that established distance education and communication  
18 within Micronesia, and has since developed into UOG’s current TADEO program;  
19 and

20           **WHEREAS**, upon completion of that duty, Dr. Carriveau transferred to the  
21 Richard Flores Taitano Micronesian Area Research Center (MARC) to work on the  
22 Micronesian Area Tropical Agriculture Bibliographic Database Project, also  
23 known as (MATABDB); and from 1976 to 1979, Dr. Carriveau served  
24 simultaneously as Dean of Library Services and Director of MARC; and

25           **WHEREAS**, in 1988, Dr. Carriveau retired as Professor Emeritus of Library  
26 Science; and after his retirement from the University of Guam and his involvement  
27 with other organizations, Dr. Carriveau continued to stay involved with the

1 University through his association with the Society of Professors Emeritus and  
2 Retired Professors, and by writing grant proposals for the Richard Flores Taitano  
3 Micronesian Area Research Center; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau served as Regional Project Director for the  
5 Pacific Postsecondary Education Council’s TRIO program; he served as President  
6 of the Guam Restaurant and Hotel Association for two (2) years; and he served as  
7 Superintendent of Catholic Schools; and

8 **WHEREAS**, upon his wife’s passing, Dr. Carriveau entered the Blessed  
9 John XXII National Seminary in Weston, Massachusetts, a house of formation for  
10 second career men, where in May 2003, he received his Master of Divinity; and

11 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Carriveau was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on June 14,  
12 2003, and appointed to the San Isidro Catholic Church, where he served as Pastor  
13 and Spiritual Director of the community of *Malojloj* for six (6) years; and

14 **WHEREAS**, one of Dr. Carriveau’s proudest accomplishments, among  
15 many others, was helping to establish the Pan-Pacific Education and  
16 Communication Experiments by Satellite program (PEACESAT), which was  
17 introduced at the UOG through the Library. Doug Trail and Dr. Cariveau had  
18 worked together to get it established, and turned it over to the College of Education  
19 for further development, where it has been a boon to the University ever since; and

20 **WHEREAS**, another proud accomplishment of Dr. Carriveau was when he  
21 collaborated with the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences in developing the  
22 Micronesian Area Tropical Agriculture Bibliographic Database (MATABDB)  
23 Project, which continues as the Guam and Micronesia Virtual Library. MATABDB  
24 was primarily a document retrieval system with copies of the documents in the  
25 Guam & Micronesia Collection, whereas the Virtual Library now allows UOG  
26 students and scholars worldwide to access UOG publications and other documents  
27 about the Micronesian region online; now therefore, be it

1           **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trentai Dos Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does  
2 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize, commend and thank the  
3 Reverend Father Kenneth Cariveau, Ph.D., for his multi-faceted contributions in  
4 developing opportunities throughout Micronesia for its people to compete and  
5 succeed in the 21<sup>st</sup> century; and be it further


6           **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest
