After finishing her basic training in Great Lakes, Illinois, she completed the Hospital Corpsman "A" School, also in Great Lakes. In the years that followed, she furthered her education and received a Bachelor of Science degree from the Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, in 2001; and

**WHEREAS**, Petty Officer Craver's first overseas assignment was at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Okinawa, Japan, from 1996 to 1999, where she was assigned to the Pediatric Clinic and the Immunizations Clinic. Ms. Craver was also stationed at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Sigonella, Italy, from 2002 to 2005; and at the Branch Medical Clinic in Diego Garcia from 2009 to 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, Tungu's shore duty assignments included serving at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Bremerton, Washington, from 1999 to 2002; and at the Branch Health Clinic at Washington Navy Yard in Washington, D.C., from 2005 to 2009; and

**WHEREAS**, Petty Officer Craver's first assignment as an Assistant Lead Petty Officer was at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Bremerton, Washington, where she worked second shift in the Supply Department from 1999 to 2002, after which she was reassigned to the Hospital's Auxiliary Security Force (ASF) until March 2002; and

**WHEREAS**, Petty Officer Craver later transferred to the U.S. Naval Hospital in Sigonella, Italy, where she was assigned to serve one year in Medical Records, one year in the Medical Logistics Department, and one year in Biomedical Repair. Her next assignment was at the Branch Health Clinic of Washington Navy Yard in Washington, D.C., where she worked in Medical Records, as an Audiogram Technician, as a Tricare Information Manager, and as a Customer Service Administrator; and she then quickly transitioned a year later to Dental Lead Petty Officer, before deploying to the Horn of Africa; and

**WHEREAS**, after returning from deployment, Petty Officer Craver was assigned as Lead Petty Officer of the Clinic's Medical Readiness Reporting System (MRRS) until transferring in March 2009 to Diego Garcia as the Medical Lead Petty Officer until deploying in June 2010 to Kuwait. Petty Officer Craver's next assignment following her deployment to Kuwait was working in the fast-paced Patient Administration Department as the Assistant Lead Petty Officer until detachment in March 2011 to U.S. Naval Hospital Guam; and

**WHEREAS**, upon arriving at U.S. Naval Hospital Guam, Tungu was assigned to serve as Lead Petty Officer and Interim Department Head of the Operating Management Department overseeing the Command's Communications (landlines, cellphones and pagers), Security Clearances, Command Engraving Placards, Hospital Security, Command Key Custodial Program, and Fire Management Program; and

**WHEREAS**, later Petty Officer Craver transferred to the Patient Administration's Medical Records Division, where she spearheaded the reduction of a 12 year backlog and implemented the closed records system that allowed the Division to maintain positive control of the 22,000 records inventory. She enforced guidelines and accounted for a 60% decrease in misplaced or lost medical records, and she continued to enforce guidelines on a daily basis; and


**WHEREAS**, Petty Officer Craver will now be transferring to the U.S. Naval Reserve Professional Development Center in New Orleans, Louisiana, in April 2013 to carry out her last duty assignment as an instructor until her retirement; and

**WHEREAS**, in recognition of her superior work and service at U.S. Naval Hospital Guam and other stations throughout her career, Petty Officer First Class Tungu S. Craver has been recognized with 4 Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals, 5 Good Conduct Medals, and a Navy Rifleman and Navy Pistol Medal, now therefore, be it


