WHEREAS, Mr. Jesus Charfauros, affectionately known as Jesus "Chamorro" Charfauros to the people of Guam, the Marianas, Micronesia, and wherever Chamorros gather, was born in Agat on February 2, 1933; and is the son of Faustino Lagaña Charfauros and Dolores Ofrecio Cruz; and

WHEREAS, Jesus Chamorro graduated from George Washington High School in 1955; and after graduating from high school, he began serving the people of Guam as an employee of the Public Utility Agency of Guam (now the Guam Waterworks Authority); and

WHEREAS, in 1958, Jesus enlisted in the U.S. Army and served with the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division "Tropic Lightning" at Schofield Barracks in Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, in 1961, Jesus Chamorro married Sylvia Francisco Campos, and together they raised four (4) children: Mark, Sylvina, Matthew and Mikangelo; and

WHEREAS, after returning home from serving in the Army, Jesus worked at the Department of Revenue and Taxation, where he held numerous positions and performed various duties, to include Processing, Processing Supervisor, Audit, Audit Supervisor, and Technical and Research; and he was detailed to work in Saipan to assist the Commonwealth of the Mariana Islands (CNMI) in the adoption of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code in their tax system; and

WHEREAS, in 1973, Jesus received the Chi Omicron Gamma, Honorary Scholastic Society of University of Guam (UOG) Award for his outstanding scholastic achievements and academic excellence; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, Jesus Chamorro began working at local radio station KUAM 610 with his brother, Tommy Charfauros, when they took over the "Chamorro Hour" radio show, which later became known as "Programma Chamorrta," which filled the airwaves with Chamorro language and music; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, Jesus Chamorro retired from the government of Guam; and after retiring, he worked for Landscape Management Systems, Inc. (LMS) and DeBasi Landscaping; and

WHEREAS, in 1989, Jesus Chamorro began Programan Kambeasion and performed in numerous evening Chamorro shows at several local venues, such as Joe & Flo's, Lanchos, Major Mango, Cheap Charlie's, Double A and Mungi Lounge; and

WHEREAS, in 1991, Jesus Chamorro received the Guam Annual Media Award for Excellence in Public Service Program/Broadcast; and

WHEREAS, Jesus Chamorro will forever be remembered for his passion and work to preserve the Chamorro culture and language through music; and his knowledge and creative use of the Chamorro language has inspired countless local Chamorro singers and artists; and

WHEREAS, Jesus Chamorro will forever serve as a role model to many of our island's radio disc jockeys, who have been inspired by his eccentric, entertaining, and original on-air performances; and

WHEREAS, during the UOG Spring 2012 Commencement Ceremony, Jesus Chamorro received an honorary Master of Micronesian Traditional Knowledge from the University of Guam to honor him for his lifetime of work in promoting the Chamorro language and culture; and


WHEREAS, in September 2012, Jesus Chamorro was honored at a celebration on his behalf in a musical event called, "One More Night with Jesus Chamorro Charfauros," where numerous Chamorro musicians came together to play many popular Chamorro songs; and






