**Relative to recognizing and commending the Management and Staff of the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam, on winning the coveted “Best Float Award” at the 69<sup>th</sup> Liberation Day Parade, in the Medium Sized Government Category, for an unprecedented three years in a row.**

1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN***  
2 ***GUÅHAN*:**  
3           **WHEREAS, the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam**  
4 **(GIAA) had won the coveted Liberation Day Parade “Best Float” Award at the 67<sup>th</sup>**  
5 **and 68<sup>th</sup> Liberation Day Parades; and**

1           **WHEREAS**, in this year’s 69<sup>th</sup> Liberation Day Parade, GIAA entered the first-  
2 ever Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) concept float, depicting  
3 stories of the faith and courage of the Guamanian people; and

4           **WHEREAS**, eighty percent of this year’s GIAA float utilized recycled  
5 materials and solar panels, with four mechanized components powered by solar  
6 energy, symbolizing the responsible stewardship of our resources and forward-  
7 thinking leadership; and

8           **WHEREAS**, each of the four solar powered mechanical components  
9 highlighted a symbolic story of faith and courage of our people:

10           (a) The *first* component was of a grandmother holding her grandchild as she  
11 learns to walk, symbolizing the cultural leap of faith we take with guidance from our  
12 elders;

13           (b) The *second* component featured a façade of the Airport Terminal, Guam’s  
14 “Gateway to the World,” symbolizing the courageous effort of the people of Guam in  
15 building a modern state-of-the-art transportation facility, the single largest capital  
16 improvement project undertaken on Guam, and the bravery of our island service  
17 members who have stepped up to military service in record numbers;

18           (c) The *third* component featured a yellow ribbon, symbolizing our unwavering  
19 support for our troops, as well as those brave men and women of Micronesia who  
20 have paid the ultimate sacrifice;

21           (d) The *fourth* and final component featured a *pala p̄ala* with *Latte* stone pillars  
22 and a solar powered airplane flying above, symbolizing the strength and resilience of  
23 the *Chamorro* people who had faced trials and tribulations, yet have persevered and  
24 prospered from a war-torn island sixty-nine years ago; and

1           **WHEREAS**, this year’s GIAA LEED float concept, telling the stories of our  
2 people’s faith and courage, speaks to the compelling creativity of our Airport  
3 Employees, and of the responsible stewardship and resilience of our people - past,  
4 present and future; now therefore, be it

5           **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina’Trentai Dos Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby,  
6 on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend the Board of Directors,  
7 management, and employees of the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport  
8 Authority, Guam, on winning the “Best Float Award” at the 69<sup>th</sup> Liberation Day  
9 Parade, for an unprecedented three years in a row; and be it further

10           **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to,  
11 the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mr. Frank  
12 Santos, Chairman of the Board of Directors, Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport
