BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

2 MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, family violence, whether physical, sexual, emotional or verbal in nature, and directed against a person who is the abuser's intimate partner, relative or friend, affects any person regardless of age, sexual orientation, physical ability, marital status, ethnicity, culture, education, religion, or economic status; and

WHEREAS, research highlights that children in homes where abuse among adults occurs are often neglected at a higher rate than the national average, and studies further show that children from violent homes have a higher risk of alcohol or drug abuse, and juvenile delinquency; they are six (6) times more likely to commit suicide; twenty-four (24) times more likely to commit sexual assault crimes; and fifty (50) times more likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; stressing that children from abusive homes carry these terrible experiences of violence with them into adulthood, and into the next generation; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, Guam Police Department statistics show that there were four hundred twenty-four (424) violent crimes/family violence related arrests. Of that number, four hundred five (405) arrests involved offenses against the family and children; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, the Superior Court of Guam, Courts and Ministerial Division, reported three hundred eighty-eight (388) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor family violence, one hundred (100) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor criminal sexual conduct, and one hundred thirty-seven (137) protection orders filed; which amount to six hundred twenty-five (625) newly opened and active cases within the Probation Services Division, and a grand total of nine hundred sixty (960) defendants under Probation's supervision by the end of 2012; and

WHEREAS, in 2012, the *Alee* Shelter, the Department of Corrections' Parole Services Division, Erica's House, the Guam Police Department's Victim Assistance Unit (VAU), the Public Defender Service Corporation, the Office of the Attorney

- 1 General's Victim Witness Ayuda Services (VWAS), the Judiciary of Guam, and
- 2 Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO) have provided one thousand one hundred
- 3 seventy-seven (1177) victims with direct services, and have facilitated additional
- 4 referrals to other service providers; and

- 5 **WHEREAS**, family violence is often ignored and tolerated by society, leaving
- 6 many victims to feel isolated, ashamed, and even responsible for the abuse, often
- 7 blaming themselves; with many men and women being reluctant to admit to the
- 8 incidence of family violence; and who often have trouble seeking help beyond their
- 9 families. This problem leads some experts to believe that the actual prevalence of
- 10 family violence is much higher than the statistics indicate; and
 - WHEREAS, the Family Violence and Sexual Assault practitioners and advocates, the STOP Violence Against Women sub grantees, government and non-government organizations, faith-based organizations, and other community partners have joined forces to directly and collectively confront this family violence crises. These community organizations include the following: *Alee* Shelter Catholic Social Service; Andersen Family Support Services Fleet and Family Support Services; the Archdiocese of *Agaña*; the Office of the Attorney General Crime Victim Response Unit; the Department of Corrections Parole Division/Training; the Guam Department of Education; the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center –
