BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, it is the custom of this Legislative Body to recognize official months that are set aside to focus on the story of our island's past from a new perspective by concentrating on the critically economic, cultural, social, and other notable contributions that members of our community had made in countless ways toward the development of Guam history; and

WHEREAS, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-standing traditions, this Legislative Body is justly proud to join the Nation in celebrating the month of October as Filipino American Heritage Month; and

WHEREAS, the first recorded Filipinos to arrive in Guam came by way of the Spanish galleon between the Philippines and Mexico, which began in 1521, that brought Filipino soldiers, missionaries, lay assistants, administrators, and political dissidents and exiles, to Guam; and

WHEREAS, in the aftermath of World War II, Guam's reconstruction effort was joined by many skilled Filipino laborers, longshoremen, and service workers; and

WHEREAS, the manpower required during this period led to the recruitment of thousands of skilled and unskilled workers and professionals, mostly from the Iloilo province of the Philippines, resulting in a migration of more than 10,000 Filipino men and women to Guam; many laborers lived in work camps, the largest of which was Camp Roxas in Agat with over 7,000 workers; and

WHEREAS, through the postwar devastation in the 1950s, the widespread destruction in the wake of two typhoons, Karen and Olive, in the 1960s, and the massive tourism buildup in the 1970s, Filipino-American grit, skill, and industry helped to strengthen our island for the challenges and opportunities of a new century; and

WHEREAS, the Filipino-American community is now the largest Asian-American group in Guam, making up 26.3 percent of the total island population, and the second largest Asian-American group in the United States, with a population of approximately 3.4 million; and

WHEREAS, Filipino Americans have been a part of the American experience and have remained resolute and steadfast in the face of many difficult times and challenges; and 1 WHEREAS, Filipino-American servicemen and servicewomen have a time-

2 honored history serving in the Armed Services, from the War of 1812 to the Iraq and

Afghanistan conflicts, including the 250,000 Filipinos who fought under the United

States flag during World War II to protect and defend this country; and

WHEREAS, nine (9) Filipino Americans have received the Congressional Medal of Honor, the highest award for valor in action against an enemy force that can be bestowed upon an individual serving in the United States Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, Filipino Americans are an integral part of the island's health care system as nurses, doctors, and other medical professionals; and

WHEREAS, Filipino Americans have contributed greatly to the fine arts, music, dance, literature, education, business, literature, journalism, sports, fashion, politics, government, science, technology, and other fields in Guam and in the United States that enrich the landscape of our local community and the Nation as a whole; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative for Filipino American youths to have positive role models and to instill in them the importance of education, complemented with the richness of their ethnicity, the history of the indomitable will of their countrymen, and the values of their legacy; and now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Dos Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby recognize the celebration of Filipino American Heritage Month in the month of October of every year to serve as a significant time to study the advancement of Filipino Americans in the history of Guam and of the United States, as a favorable time of celebration, remembrance, reflection, and motivation and as a relevant time to renew more efforts toward research, examination, and promulgation of Filipino American history and culture in order to provide an opportunity for all Americans to learn and appreciate more about Filipino Americans

- and their historic contributions to Guam and our Nation; and urges the people of
- 2 Guam to observe Filipino American History Month with appropriate programs and
- 3 activities; and be it further
