1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**  
2 ***MINA TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3           **WHEREAS**, drug and alcohol abuse has devastating consequences on the  
4 community at large, most especially on families and youth who have endured first-  
5 hand the harmful effects of this widespread epidemic. As an island community, we  
6 value the health and safety of our residents, especially Guam’s youth. Today, we face  
7 many challenges as we try to protect our loved ones from the ongoing battle against  
8 substance abuse; and

9           **WHEREAS**, substance abuse, either through the use of drugs or alcohol, not  
10 only has a negative effect on individuals, families, businesses and schools, but it is  
11 also a contributing factor in the three (3) leading causes of death among adolescents,  
12 which are accidents, homicides, and suicides; and

13           **WHEREAS**, the “Red Ribbon Campaign” began in 1985 after drug traffickers  
14 in Mexico City murdered Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) agent Enrique  
15 “Kiki” Camarena. His friends and neighbors wore red badges of satin signifying their  
16 utmost respect and admiration for his courage, determination, and his honorable and  
17 ultimate sacrifice; and to show that they would continue to take up his fight against  
18 illegal drug activities. The mission of the “Red Ribbon Campaign” is to present a  
19 unified and visible commitment towards the creation of a “Drug-Free America”; and

20           **WHEREAS**, recognizing the seriousness of this threat, the National Family  
21 Partnership initiated the first “Red Ribbon Campaign” in 1986. This grassroots effort  
22 emphasized education and the importance of teaching children, teenagers, families,  
23 and communities about the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse. It is now the oldest  
24 and largest drug prevention program that reaches millions of youth, families and  
25 communities in every corner of the country. Significant progress has been made in  
26 reducing drug and alcohol abuse among young adults; and

1           **WHEREAS**, Guam’s participation in this national effort was started in 1988 by  
2 the *Dededo* Drug-Free Organization (now known as Youth for Youth LIVE! Guam);  
3 the 2013 Red Ribbon Committee is chaired by the Judiciary of Guam, with the  
4 following co-chairs: the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration; the Guam National  
5 Guard Counterdrug Program; the U.S. District Court of Guam; the U.S. Probation  
6 Office; the U.S. Attorney’s Office; and the Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency;  
7 and

8           **WHEREAS**, the 2013 “Red Ribbon Campaign” theme is: “A Healthy Me Is  
9 Drug Free!” and some of this year’s activities include: a poster contest; a school gate  
10 decorating contest; a basketball contest; a Red Ribbon Wave in *Hagåtña*; a  
11 community outreach at Guam Premier Outlets; a “Say Boo to Drugs” community  
12 event; school presentations; as well as numerous print, TV, and radio media events;  
13 and

14           **WHEREAS**, education, prevention and outreach activities are critical weapons  
15 in the community’s effort to fight substance abuse. It is the goal of the “Red Ribbon  
16 Campaign Committee” to involve families, schools, businesses, churches, law  
17 enforcement agencies and service organizations to establish an atmosphere that  
18 supports awareness and education that will help to prevent illegal drug related  
19 activities; and

20           **WHEREAS**, on the occasion of 2013 “Red Ribbon Month”, *I Mina’ Trentai*  
21 *Dos Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* encourages all residents to consider ways to participate  
22 in this important effort. As we build upon the successes of the past, we strengthen the  
23 Guam of tomorrow; and with strong resolve and creative leadership, we must strive to  
24 protect our community from the preventable dangers of alcohol, tobacco, and drug  
25 abuse; and

1           **WHEREAS**, these activities are made possible by the Red Ribbon Campaign  
2 Committee, which is comprised of the Judiciary of Guam – Probation/Juvenile Drug  
3 Court; the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration; the Guam National Guard  
4 Counterdrug Program; the U.S. District Court of Guam and the U.S. Probation Office  
5 for the districts of Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands  
6 (CNMI); the U.S. Attorney’s Office for the districts of Guam and the CNMI; the  
7 Guam Customs and Quarantine Agency; the Guam Department of Education; the U.S.  
8 Department of Defense Education Activities; the Guam Fire Department; the Guam  
9 Police Department; the Mayor’s Council of Guam; the U.S. Marine Corps Activity,  
10 Guam; the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam; the U.S. Air Force 36<sup>th</sup> Wing; Big Brothers Big  
11 Sisters of Guam; the Guam Chamber of Commerce; the *Agaña* Shopping Center;  
12 Advance Management, Inc.; WestCare-Pacific Islands; the U.S. Coast Guard; Guam  
13 Premier Outlets (GPO); the Office of the Governor; the Office of the Attorney  
14 General of Guam; Island Girl Power; Sanctuary, Inc.; KUAM; the Marianas Variety;  
15 the Pacific Daily News; the Sorenson Media Group; Tango, Inc., dba: Micronesia  
16 Mall and Stadium Theaters; Pacific American Title; Hollywood Theaters – Guam  
17 Megaplex Cinemas; the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center; the U.S.  
18 Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives; Guam Joint Region Marianas;  
19 the U.S. Marshals Service; U.S. Naval Base Guam; the Department of Corrections; the  
20 Department of Youth Affairs; Victims Advocate Reaching Out (VARO); Youth for  
21 Youth LIVE!; the Micronesia Mall; and KIII FM 104.3. These awareness efforts will  
22 concentrate on promoting healthy choices and lifestyles that are both drug and  
23 violence-free; now therefore, be it

24           **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina’ Trentai Dos Na*  
25 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people  
26 of Guam, recognize and commend the members of the Red Ribbon Campaign

1 Committee on the occasion of “Red Ribbon Month” during the month of October  
2 2013, and extend *Un Dangkolo Na Si Yu’os Ma’ãse’* to these individuals and  
3 organizations for the significant contributions they have made, and continue to make,  
4 to eliminate drug and alcohol abuse on the island of Guam; and does further call upon  
5 and encourage the people of Guam to support the Red Ribbon Campaign activities, to  
6 be involved in the events and programs that aim to protect our community from the  
7 dangers of alcohol, tobacco and drug abuse, and to wear a red ribbon during “National


