WHEREAS, the members of the U.S. Armed Services who have served honorably during times of war in which this country's freedom was at stake, and in times of peace, deserve a special salute from the Guam Legislature; and

WHEREAS, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-standing traditions, the Guam Legislature is justly proud to commend and pay tribute to Lloyd Glick for his valiant efforts as a service member in the United States Navy in the Pacific Campaign during World War II; and

WHEREAS, during the noble event on February 3, 2014, Lloyd Glick will be presented with a commemorative medallion by War in the Pacific National Historical Park personnel, and a "Welcome Liberators" award by the Guam Visitors Bureau; and

WHEREAS, born in California on December 28, 1923, Lloyd Glick, a long-time Huntington Beach resident and musician, has been married to Judy Glick for thirty-eight (38) years; and he retired from the Los Angeles Police Department as the Department Bugler in 2013, after over twenty (20) years of service; and

WHEREAS, already an accomplished trumpet player for the University of California Symphony, Lloyd Glick was nineteen (19) years old when he enlisted in the United States Navy in 1942 to attend the prestigious U.S. Naval School of Music. Glick was eventually detailed as a Musician Second Class with the twenty-piece band aboard the battleship USS North Carolina while it participated in the bombings of Saipan, Guam, Palau, and Pohnpei, and in other battles in the region throughout the Pacific Campaign of World War II; and

WHEREAS, after Japan's surrender in 1945 and the return of Lloyd Glick's band to the United States to board another military vessel, Glick continued in his craft and has played in both swing bands and professional-level community groups for the last seventy (70) years. Upon his retirement from the Automobile Club of Southern California in 1990, Glick joined the Los Angeles Police Department Band, and he was eventually appointed to serve as a Reserve Police Officer and he became the LAPD Department Bugler until his retirement in 2013; and

WHEREAS, Lloyd Glick's service to his country and his dedication to his Los Angeles community, and the state of California, are exemplary of his resolve and commitment to making positive contributions to those around him; and his notable accomplishments as part of the United States Armed Forces that engaged in many battles in the Pacific are honored by the people of Guam; now therefore, be it
