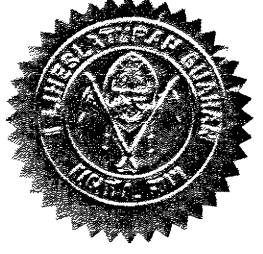

10 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Natividad's most recent project has been the development
11 of behavioral health services for the American Medical Center, employing the
12 Integrated Care Model that addresses clients' physical and emotional dimensions
13 of self. As part of her efforts, she contributed to creating a private-practice setting
14 for behavioral health providers to engage with individuals and serve the people of
15 our island; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Natividad has a long-standing commitment to human
17 rights and social justice work. She represented Guam and spoken about the
18 struggle of the Chamorro people in our island and those in other international
19 countries. She presented a testimony before the United Nations' Decolonization
20 Committee, participated in the United Nations regional seminars and wrote the
21 2013 Alta Declaration of Indigenous People to be introduced at the United
22 Nations' World Conference of Indigenous People that will be held in New York,
23 2014; and

24 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Natividad expressed her love and passion for her social
25 work profession through the writing accomplishments listed and through her
26 writing in four book chapters and numerous articles on decolonization,

1 demilitarization, and culturally proficient practice for working with the Chamorro
2 people; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Natividad embodies the core values of social work in her
4 deep commitment to social justice and human rights, which she espouses to the
5 students that she has educated. She has gone above and beyond as a human service
6 professional and continues to increase the public’s awareness and integrity of the
7 profession; and now, be it

8 **RESOLVED**, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam,
9 recognize and congratulate Dr. Lisalinda Natividad as the 2014 Lifetime
10 Achievement Awardee of the National Association of Social Workers- Guam
11 Chapter and further extend an Un Dångkolo na Si Yu’os Ma’åse’ for her service to
12 our island’s most vulnerable individuals and for her commitment to the success of
13 the social work students of our island community; and be it further

14 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on
15 Rules certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof,
16 and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Dr. Lisalinda Natividad;
17 and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga’lahen Guåhan*.
