12 display substance abuse behaviors. The mission of the Juvenile Drug Court is to
13 integrate drug treatment services with the juvenile justice system, including law
14 enforcement personnel, prosecutors, defense attorneys, and education system
15 representatives to work in a coordinated effort in addressing adolescent drug and
16 alcohol abuse; and

17 **WHEREAS**, from May 9, 2003, to May 7, 2013, the JDC graduated two
18 hundred eighty-one (281) youths from its Intensive Track. The JDC operates and
19 works with over three hundred (300) JDC students annually, along with an active case
20 load of two hundred sixty-one (261); and

21 **WHEREAS**, the ADC also continues to graduate individuals and assist them
22 with obtaining employment while they undergo treatment and participate in the ADC
23 program; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the administrators of the Drug Offender Re-Entry Program


