WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa is the son of +Pedro Changuaf Espinosa and +Josefina Tyquiengco Espinosa; and

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa fell in love and married Tatsue Nakamachi, his wife of fifty-seven (57) years, on October 1, 1957, at the American Embassy in Tokyo, Japan, and they have a beloved family pet named Charie; and

WHEREAS, on March 30, 1955, the late Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa joined the United States Army, where he actively engaged in Foreign and Sea Service for about two and a half (2½) years; and he then proudly served our island and country for approximately twenty-one (21) years, until he retired on February 29, 1973 as a Sergeant First Class (SFC), E-7; and

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa had fought in the Korean War, and he served two tours in the Vietnam War. SFC Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa had received several commendations during his decorated military career, to include: the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal; the Purple Heart Medal; the National Defense Service Medal; the Expert Infantry Badge; the Combat Infantryman's Badge; the United Nations Service Medal; the Korean Service Medal; the Army Occupation Medal; the Vietnam Service Medal; the Vietnam Campaign Medal with entry (60) device; the Bronze Star Medal; the Army Commendation Medal; the Good Conductor Medal (6th Award); and Three O/S bars; and

WHEREAS, the late Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa escorted the body of his brother, U.S. Marine Corps Sergeant Vicente T. Espinosa, home to Guam after he was killed in action in the Vietnam War on March 27, 1969; and

WHEREAS, after retiring from active duty, Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa and his wife moved back to Guam and they resided in the village of *Makasa* for over forty (40) years. They opened a fruit stand and named it the "Espinosa Fruit Stand," which is still in operation to this day; and

WHEREAS, after retirement, Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa spent his retired years creating a banana plantation on his property, along with a variety of mango trees; and

WHEREAS, after his retirement, Joaquin Tyquiengco Espinosa had also served as an ROTC Instructor at George Washington High School, where he eventually retired after many years of service; and


