Mangibin on his nomination to serve as the Republic of the Philippines Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Kenya; and to further extending a warm and sincere Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to him for his countless and invaluable contributions to the strengthening of the economic, cultural and educational ties between the people of the Philippines and Guam, and wish him Godspeed on his new assignment.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

3 **WHEREAS,** Philippine Consul General Bayani V. Mangibin is married to 4 Carmen Encarnado Mangibin; and they have four children: Jose Bayani, Mark, Menni,

and Bianca Mangibin. Philippine Consul General Bayani V. Mangibin has held many 1 admirable positions in the government, and in his previous work experiences in the 2 3 private sector. Consul General Mangibin has achieved many accomplishments 4 throughout his years of service as the Philippine Consulate General in Guam, ranking 5 Chief of Mission I. The positive impact that he made between the Philippines and 6 Guam led to his being nominated to serve as the Ambassador Extraordinary and 7 Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Kenya, with concurrent jurisdiction over the 8 Republic of Burundi, the Union of the Comoros, the Democratic Republic of the 9 Congo, the Republic of the Congo, the Republic of Madagascar, the Republic of Mauritius, the Republic of Rwanda, the Republic of Seychelles, the Somali Republic, 10 the United Republic of Tanzania, and the Republic of Uganda; and as Permanent 11 12 Representative to the United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP) and 13 HABITAT; and

14 WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin preserved and enhanced national 15 security through initiating a defense cooperation and assistance between the Armed 16 Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and the Guam National Guard (GNG). On October 17 12, 2013, the GNG, headed by Colonel David B. Riano and Colonel L. Charfauros, visited Consul General Mangibin to provide a briefing on the achievements and the 18 future events lined up for the State Partnership Program between the AFP and GNG, 19 which focused on civil military cooperation, professional development, and 20 21 humanitarian assistance/disaster response (HADR); and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin continued to strengthen his collaboration with the Office of the U.S. Attorney for Guam and CNMI with respect to counter-terrorism. With this partnership, he receives counter-terrorism and intelligence updates from the office of the National Security Specialist, which he then
would forward to the Department for information; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin continued to sit as a member of the Human Trafficking Task Force Outreach and Research Committee, which was organized by the Office of the U.S. Attorney for Guam and the CNMI. His officers regularly attended the meetings called by the U.S. Attorney's office, which also provided Consul General Mangibin with the opportunity to network with community stakeholders and counterparts; and

9 WHEREAS, as part of the AFP-GNG State Partnership Program, the Guam 10 National Guard, in partnership with the Defense Threat Reduction Agency (DTRA), 11 and with the coordination of the Consul General, continued to provide and enhance 12 disaster response trainings to the AFP that has contributed to a noticeable increase in 13 the AFP's and the country's disaster response and management capabilities; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin has promoted and attained economic 14 15 security through the many activities that he initiated, facilitated, coordinated and 16 monitored. He continues to monitor the developments of the Guam Military Buildup, 17 which is expected to bring employment and other business opportunities for both 18 Filipino workers and corporations. Consul General Mangibin and Vice Consul Marie 19 Paz Cortes met with the United Airlines representatives, Mr. Samuel Shinohara, 20 Managing Director of Business Development-Asia Pacific Division, and Mr. Quentin 21 Koch, Director of Sales-Guam and Micronesia, to discuss a possible partnership with 22 the airline company in the Consulate's tourism and cultural promotion. United 23 Airlines representatives assured him that they will assist him in his commitment to 24 promote the Philippines as one of the prime tourist destinations in the Asia Pacific 25 Region; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Bayani Mangibin met with the representatives of
the Guam Chamber of Commerce, headed by its Vice Chairman of the Board of
Directors, Mr. John Brown, and its President, Mr. David Leddy, on January 22, 2013,
to discuss the possibility of establishing a Philippine-Guam Chamber of Commerce on
Guam, and to gather consensus among the stakeholders; and

6 WHEREAS, on April 9, 2013, Consul General Mangibin met with Guam 7 Department of Public Health and Social Services officials to discuss the approved 8 Expanded Guam Medicaid State Plan (Medicaid Portability). The amendment of the 9 Guam Medicaid Program State Plan was approved by the Centers for Medicare and 10 Medicaid Services (CMS) on April 4, 2013, making it the first to expand Medicaid 11 services outside the United States, and which now includes the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin met with Administrator Henry Taitano of the Guam Economic Development Authority to discuss issues concerning the establishment of the Guam-Philippines Chamber of Commerce/Business Council, and other issues concerning the Guam Regional Medical City; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin, accompanied by Consul Maria Paz Cortes and Mr. Emmanuel Garcia, met with the members of the Guam Chamber of Commerce on June 20, 2013, to discuss the establishment of a Philippine-Guam Business Group under the auspices of the Chamber, and proposed a visit to Guam by the members of the Makati Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Makati Chamber of Commerce and Industry, led by its President Emelita Alvarez, were on Guam for a week-long trade mission. The group was able to connect and network with various business leaders on Guam, including representatives from several key industries, such as construction, real estate, medical, and other allied professions, as well as accounting, consulting, and
legal offices; and

WHEREAS, among Consul General Mangibin's many accomplishments in bolstering economic activities, he constantly promoted Philippine Fairs and Exhibits, such as the Manila Fame, in which he sent brochures and flyers to the Guam Chamber of Commerce for information and dissemination to its members, particularly those who are property developers, furniture and fashion importers, and retailers. Consul General Mangibin attended to queries on various Philippine products, as well as information on Philippine retirement havens; and

10 WHEREAS, in his accomplishments in cultural diplomacy, Consul General Mangibin participated in the commemoration of various events, which have been 11 12 traditionally celebrated and have significant history in the Philippines; to include events such as the 27th Year Anniversary of the EDSA "People Power" Revolution 13 celebration; the 115th Year Anniversary of the Proclamation of Philippine 14 Independence Day; Buwan ng Wikang Pambansa; the commemoration of Filipino-15 American Heritage Month; the Opening of the Exhibits at the Philippine Consulate 16 17 General; and many other events; and

WHEREAS, the Philippine Consulate General officers and staff headed by 18 19 Consul General Mangibin have always supported the Filipino organizations on Guam by attending and participating in the many local functions, such as the Santo Niño 20 21 Guam Fiesta celebration; the induction of the Filipino Community of Guam (FCG) 22 Officers; the induction of the newly-elected Officers of the University of Santo Tomas 23 Alumni Organization of Guam; the crowning of the Filipino Ladies Association of 24 Guam's Mrs. Sampaguita Contest; the Apalit Fluvial Festival; the Feast of Our Lady of Penafrancia; and many others; and 25

1 WHEREAS, Filipinos on Guam have always extended their sympathies and generous help to our "Kababayans" who were affected by the different calamities in 2 the Philippines. From January to October 2013, various Filipino organizations sent 3 donations to its beneficiaries through the Consulate General, to include donations that 4 5 were given by the Bataan Association of Guam, Iloilo International, the UST Alumni Association of Guam, the Filipino Ladies Association of Guam, Cabuhat & Cabuhat 6 Tech Services, the Filipino American Presidents Club of Guam, Guam Filipino 7 8 Artists, and donations from Ms. Atilana Rambayon; and

9 WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin protected the rights and promoted the 10 welfare of overseas Filipinos. As part of its program to assist new Filipino workers 11 and immigrants on Guam, he conducted the 9th Post Arrival Orientation Seminar 12 (PAOS) on May 27, 2012. From January to October 2013, he handled a total of 85 13 ATN cases in Guam, the CNMI, the Republic of Palau, and the Federated States of 14 Micronesia; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin participated in institution building to enhance personnel awareness of gender related issues. He coordinated a local nonprofit organization, whose advocacy focuses on increasing awareness on the issue of violence against women, in order to provide an opportunity for Philippine Consulate General officers and staff to undergo training on this issue; and

WHEREAS, Consul General Mangibin has been a true friend of all the Guamanian people, and he will be missed by many when he leaves Guam after serving with distinction as head of post of the Philippine Consulate Office on Guam; now therefore, be it
