**Relative to recognizing and commending Captain Philip E. Old for his exceptional support services to the people of Guam as the Director of the Joint Guam Program Office Forward; and to further extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to him for his willingness to continue partnering with the people of Guam by facilitating, managing and putting forth the efforts associated with the relocation of the U.S. Marine Corps from Okinawa to Guam.**

1        **BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN***  
2 ***GUÅHAN*:**

3        **WHEREAS,** Captain Philip E. Old has lived a life of service as a civilian and  
4 as an Officer of the U.S. Navy for decades. He has served in the U.S. Navy Reserve  
5 since August 2009, before he was recalled to permanent active duty. In his civilian

1 career, he was an attorney engaging in private practice, and concentrated on complex  
2 civil litigation matters in Chicago, Illinois, where he lived with his wife Sherri; and

3 **WHEREAS**, Captain Old's impressionable career in the U.S. Navy consists of  
4 numerous assignments, commands, and deployments prior to his present assignment  
5 at the Joint Guam Program Office Forward. He had served as the Assistant Chief of  
6 Staff for Theater Security Cooperation and Engagement for the Commander, U.S.  
7 Seventh Fleet, which was forward deployed to Yokosuka, Japan. He was responsible  
8 for the planning and coordination of all foreign engagement activities with allied and  
9 partner navies in the Western Pacific Region, including over one hundred twenty  
10 (120) combined exercises, and the annual PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP mission; and

11 **WHEREAS**, Captain Old has successfully been the Commanding Officer for  
12 several U.S. Navy commands throughout our nation while he was on reserve and  
13 active duty. While serving onboard the USS ANCHORAGE, he qualified as a Surface  
14 Warfare Officer and deployed twice to the Western Pacific; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Captain Old understands the importance of establishing and  
16 building on partnerships. As the Director of the Joint Guam Program Office Forward,  
17 he has gone above and beyond to keep the leaders and people of Guam informed  
18 about the impending military buildup on Guam; and

19 **WHEREAS**, Captain Old has successfully upheld the mission of the Joint  
20 Guam Program Office Forward by facilitating, managing and putting forth the efforts  
21 associated with the relocation of the U.S. Marine Corps from Okinawa to Guam. He  
22 has built strong partnerships with several of the island's leaders and stakeholders by  
23 engaging in discussions and plans that ensure that the government of Guam and the  
24 Department of Defense both equally benefit from the military buildup; and

25 **WHEREAS**, during all the public meetings for the DSEIS, as well as the  
26 discussions held by Guam's stakeholders, Captain Old and his colleagues were always  
27 in attendance, providing exceptional support and services to the people of Guam, and

1 listening to everyone’s concerns attentively. Captain Old was always willing to  
2 provide informational feedback to the concerns of our island community, and also  
3 communicated the importance of the submission of comments for the DSEIS, as it  
4 will be considered upon the release of the final Supplemental Environmental Impact  
5 Statement (SEIS), which is the final step in the SEIS process needed for the Record of  
6 Decision expected to be released in 2015; and

7 **WHEREAS**, Captain Old has left an everlasting impression on the people of  
8 Guam and will be considered not only as a military partner, but as a friend to many of  
9 the island’s leaders and stakeholders who have benefitted from his leadership and  
10 positive efforts for the Department of the Navy and the people of Guam. As he moves  
11 forward from his current role as the Director for the Joint Guam Program Office  
12 Forward, to other endeavors that the Department of Navy has in store for him the  
13 people of Guam wish him the very best; and

14 **WHEREAS**, Captain Old will also be further recognized by the President of  
15 the United States with the Legion of Merit for his exceptional and meritorious conduct  
16 in the performance of his outstanding service as the Director for the Joint Guam  
17 Program Office Forward from October 2012 to August 2014. He has successfully met  
18 the goals set forth in the Defense Policy Review Initiative in the relocation of the  
19 Marines to Guam. Through his engagement with the Governor of Guam and the Guam  
20 Legislature, he has provided invaluable advice and insight to keep the 8.6 Billion  
21 Dollars program on schedule; now therefore, be it

23 on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend Captain Philip E. Old for
