1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS,** through the leadership and vision of Mrs. Cecilia A.Q. Morrison,
4 former Deputy Director of the Bureau of Women’s Affairs, the AmeriCorps program was

1 launched on Guam in June 1995 through the Office of the Governor, Federal Programs
2 Office; and

3 **WHEREAS**, the initial funding of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000)
4 from the Corporation for National and Community Service supported the work of forty-
5 four (44) full-time and part-time members in both government and non-government
6 entities, including, the Catholic Social Service; the Department of Parks and Recreation;
7 *Inafa'maolek*, Inc.; Sanctuary, Inc.; and the University of Guam's College of Agriculture
8 and Life Sciences; and

9 **WHEREAS**, in 1998, the AmeriCorps program on Guam was restructured and
10 centrally administered by the Governor's Community Outreach, Federal Programs
11 Office, with volunteers recruited at three (3) placement sites, including, the Department
12 of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Youth Affairs, and the Guam Public Library
13 System. Through Executive Order No. 2005-22, the Governor's Serve Guam
14 Commission was established to oversee, administer and manage the AmeriCorps
15 programs under the purview of the Office of the Governor of Guam; and

16 **WHEREAS**, AmeriCorps programs across the United States engage more than
17 seventy-five thousand (75,000) Americans in intensive service each year at nonprofits,
18 schools, public agencies, and community and faith-based groups. Since 1994, more than
19 nine hundred thousand (900,000) AmeriCorps members have contributed more than 1.2
20 billion hours in service across the country, while tackling pressing problems and
21 mobilizing millions of volunteers for the organizations they serve; and

22 **WHEREAS**, since 2005, the Governor's Serve Guam Commission-Guam
23 AmeriCorps has received more than 14 Million Dollars from the Corporation for National
24 and Community Service to support the creation of jobs and to provide meaningful
25 pathways to opportunities for Guam's young adults entering the workforce. This
26 significant investment has helped more than one thousand five hundred (1,500) young
27 adults to learn valuable work skills, earn money for education, and develop an
28 appreciation for their citizenship; now therefore, be it


1 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Dos Na*
2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of
3 Guam, recognize the observance of the "National Day of Service and Remembrance" on
4 September 11, 2014, in honor of the victims of the September 11, 2001, attacks on the
5 United States; and does further commemorate the observance of the 20th Year
6 Anniversary of the founding of AmeriCorps, which inspired the spirit of compassion and
7 generosity that followed, notably the generations of service that continue to be supported
8 by the leadership, participants, and community partners of the Governor's Serve Guam
9 Commission-Guam AmeriCorps, and congratulate them as they join their counterparts
10 across the United States in celebrating twenty (20) years of service to our nation during
11 the month of September 2014; and be it further

12 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
13 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the
14 same be thereafter transmitted to Mrs. Cecilia A.Q. Morrison; to Ms. Doris Aguon,
15 Executive Director, Governor's Serve Guam Commission; to the members of the
16 Governor's Serve Guam Commission-Guam AmeriCorps; and to the Honorable Edward
17 J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan*.
