RELATIVE TO RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING CONGRESSWOMAN **MADELEINE** Z. BORDALLO REQUIRING INTRODUCE LEGISLATION THAT **GENERAL ELECTION** INTERVENE BETWEEN ENACTMENT OF A LAW TO VARY THE COMPENSATION OF THE GOVERNOR, LIEUTENTANT GOVERNOR, AND THE GUAM LEGISLATURE, AND ITS SENATORS IN IMPLEMENTATION, CONSISTENT WITH THE TWENTY- (27^{TH}) **SEVENTH AMENDMENT** TO THE U.S. CONSTITUTION.

- 3 **WHEREAS,** the twenty-seventh (27th) amendment to the U.S. Constitution,
- 4 which reads, "No law, varying the compensation for the services of the Senators and
- 5 Representatives, shall take effect, until an election of representatives shall have
- 6 intervened," was introduced in Congress by James Madison in 1789; and
- WHEREAS, on November 4, 2014, the people of Guam voted in a General
- 8 Election which determined the election of Governor and Lieutenant Governor and
- 9 Senators in the Guam Legislature, among other offices; and
- WHEREAS, on November 21, 2014, acting Governor Ray Tenorio introduced
- 11 Bill No. 1 (8-S), which proposed raising salaries of cabinet members and elected
- 12 officials, including the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Senators in the Guam
- 13 Legislature, and the Attorney General; and

The state of the s	WHEREAS, on November 21, 2014, acting Governor Ray Tenorio called the	
2	Guam Legislature into a Special Session on Bill No. 1 (8-S) before any public hearing	
3	could be held on the measure; and	
4	WHEREAS, during the Special Session called by acting Governor Ray Tenorio	
5	on November 21, 2014, the Guam Legislature, without having held a public hearing	
6	on the bill, passed Bill 1 (8-S) with ten (10) senators voting yes and only one (1)	
7	voting no; and	
8	WHEREAS, on November 21, 2014, acting Governor Ray Tenorio signed Bill	
9	1 (8-S) into law, as Public Law 32-208; and	
10	WHEREAS, an organization, Guamanians for a Fair Government, has been	
11	formed to oppose the pay increase authorized by Public Law 32-208; and	
12	WHEREAS, the model established by the twenty-seventh (27 th) amendment to	
13	the U.S. Constitution is a fair compromise between the need to maintain competitive	
14	compensation for public officials while also recognizing that democracy derives its	
15	strength from the people; now, therefore, be it	
16	RESOLVED, that I Mina' Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, on behalf of	
17	the people of Guam, respectfully requests that Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo	
18	introduce legislation to add a new section to the Organic Act of Guam, to read:	
19	"No law varying the compensation for the services of the Governor of	
20	Guam, the Lieutenant Governor of Guam, and/or Senators in the Guam	
21	Legislature shall take effect, until a General Election for the Guam Legislature	
22	shall have intervened."
