BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

2 MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, anyone can be a victim of stalking regardless of age, sex,
- 4 background, or gender identity, with most young women being disproportionately at
- 5 risk; and
- 6 WHEREAS, stalkers seek to intimidate their victims through repeated
- 7 unwanted contact, including harassing phone calls, text messages, or emails; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking in the United States, and on Guam, continues to be on the rise and is a form of present day slavery involving the recruitment, transportation or sale of persons for forced labor; and through the use of violence, threats and coercion, enslaved persons may be forced to work in the sex trade; as domestic laborers in factories, hotels, restaurants, and agriculture; or as peddlers or beggars; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking primarily involves exploitation, which comes in many forms, including, forcing victims into prostitution; subjecting victims to slavery or involuntary servitude; compelling victims to commit sexual acts for the purpose of creating pornography; and misleading victims into debt bondage; and

WHEREAS, in 2000, the Trafficking Victims Protection Act (22 U.S.C Sec. 7101 et seq.) was enacted by the U.S. federal government to "combat trafficking in persons, a contemporary manifestation of slavery whose victims are predominantly women and children, to ensure just and effective punishment of human traffickers, and to protect their victims"; and

WHEREAS, under the guidance of the March Against Terror, USA, the National Day of Human Trafficking Awareness and the Fight Against Concealed Enslavement (FACE) Program, an ongoing commitment by the people of the U.S. and Guam to year-round awareness of human trafficking and all other forms of modern day slavery will, through increased awareness, assist authorities in whatever it takes to disrupt and defeat the global human trafficking network; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is the fastest growing criminal industry in the world, with nearly 27 million victims; and globally, there are approximately 4.5 million victims of sex slavery, and between 100,000 to 300,000 U.S. children are enslaved in sex trafficking each year. In the U.S., the average age of recruitment into

sex slavery is 12 to 14 years old, and approximately 20 percent of all internet pornography involves children who are victims of human trafficking; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking endangers the lives of millions of people around the world, and it is a crime that knows no borders. Trafficking networks operate both domestically and transnationally, and although abuses disproportionally affect women and girls, the victims of this ongoing global tragedy are men, women, and children of all ages; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is a severe crime that deprives and violates victims of their fundamental human dignity; and

WHEREAS, all local and federal law enforcement agencies, social services organizations, victim advocacy groups, medical, mental health, and public health professionals, educational institutions, faith based organizations, the private sector, the various Consulates, and other community stakeholders must work together to effectively prevent, investigate and prosecute, and protect victims of human trafficking; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam must come together as one community to have a dialogue and to take action against all forms of oppression of the human spirit; and to combat stalking and human trafficking; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan and* the people of Guam, recognize the observance of "Stalking and Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Month" as part of the efforts to fight stalking and human trafficking in our community and throughout the world; and does commend the organizations, agencies, and individuals of our community on their continued action against stalking and human trafficking; and be it further
