- WHEREAS, in 1950, Ken Jones of Jones and Guerrero established the J & G
- 4 Thrift Market; and in 1955, the name was changed to J & G Pay-Less Supermarkets;
- 5 and

1 WHEREAS, in 1967, the second J & G Pay-Less Supermarket opened in 2 Sinajana, followed by the Northgate store in 1968; and WHEREAS, in 1973, J & G Pay-Less began Pan American Airline charters 3 twice weekly from San Francisco, California, to Guam, providing fresh fruits, 4 5 vegetables, dairy products and baked goods to the island; and 6 WHEREAS, in 1976, J & G Pay-Less opened another market in *Harmon* after 7 taking over Sav-Mor; and WHEREAS, in 1978, the footprint of Agaña changed with the opening of the 8 9 Agaña Pay-Less Supermarket in the Agaña Shopping Center, and the closure of the first store, J & G Pay-Less in Maite; and 10 11 WHEREAS, J & G Pay-Less Supermarkets increased to five (5) locations after 12 the purchase of Ada Seiyu Mart's *Dededo* and *Sinajana* locations in 1980; and 13 WHEREAS, in 1985, Calvo Enterprises purchased the five (5) J & G Pay-Less Supermarkets, and they were renamed to Pay-Less Supermarkets; and 14 15 WHEREAS, in 1986, another market was brought to the Pay-Less chain when Calvo Enterprises purchased the Oka Store from Pedro's Market, making it six (6) 16 17 store locations; and WHEREAS, in 1988, the IBM 4680 POS systems were installed at all the Pay-18 19 Less Markets to manage price consistency and operations; and 20 WHEREAS, the Micronesia Mall Pay-Less Supermarket opened in 1994 after 21 taking over Safeway Supermarket, making it the largest store in the chain; and 22 WHEREAS, in 1994, Calvo Enterprises upheld its commitment to better serve the growing community by renovating the Dededo Pay-Less store and introducing 23 24 Western Family brand products, thereby providing more affordable options to the

island's families; and

1 WHEREAS, in 1996, Pay-Less inaugurated its annual "Kick the Fat" 5K Fun 2 Run to raise money in support of non-profit organizations, and to encourage the 3 community to live healthy lives; and 4 WHEREAS, the Yigo Pay-Less Supermarket opened for business in 1999, 5 making it the northernmost store in the chain; and 6 WHEREAS, Guam's health-conscious community now has healthy food 7 options with the opening of the "Health Smart" section in the Micronesia Mall market; 8 and 9 WHEREAS, in 2006, in continuing to meet their high standards and 10 commitment, the Agaña and Sinajana Pay-Less Supermarkets were renovated; and the 11 Pay-Less Markets Community Foundation was launched to help improve the quality 12 of life for Guam's people; and at that time, the Northgate Pay-Less Market closed its 13 doors; and 14 WHEREAS, in 2008, Pay-Less Supermarket's "Go Green" campaign was 15 launched to encourage customers to use reusable bags, when all the stores began using 16 only biodegradable plastic bags; and 17 WHEREAS, in 2009, the "Small Change, Big Difference Charity," another 18 Pay-Less campaign supporting organizations that fight poverty and hunger on Guam, 19 was established; and 20 WHEREAS, in 2010, the Mangilao Pay-Less Supermarket was opened; and 21 WHEREAS, in 2011, Pay-Less Supermarkets began the "Fresh Savings for 22 Seniors" program, where customers who are fifty-five (55) years and older can have 23 ten percent (10%) taken off the price of all fresh produce; and

WHEREAS, the community was encouraged to do its part in saving the

environment with the launch of the Pay-Less "Mission: Zero Bags" (M0B) program in
