1 **WHEREAS**, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan was born on December 21, 1966, in
2 Cavite, Philippines; and is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Sixto E. and Lucia
3 Camaganacan of *Liguan Terrace, Dededo*; and

4 **WHEREAS**, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan is married to Sandi Camaganacan of
5 Honolulu, Hawaii; and they have three (3) beautiful children: Nathan, Nolan and
6 Sundrine; and

7 **WHEREAS**, on June 3, 1984, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan graduated from
8 John F. Kennedy High School. He then attended the National Radio Institute and
9 received a Diploma in Telecommunications Technology on October 14, 1992. He
10 continued with his higher education and received an Associate of Science degree in
11 Electronic Engineering Technology from the Guam Community College in May 2002,
12 and was inducted into the *Phi Theta Kappa* Honor Society. He went on to attend the
13 University of Maryland University College, where he earned a Bachelor's of Science
14 degree in Information Systems Management (IFSM) on August 13, 2012, and was
15 inducted into the *Upsilon Phi Epsilon* Honor Society for the Computing and
16 Information Disciplines. CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan is currently pursuing his dual
17 Master's degrees in Telecommunications Management and Cyber Security, and is
18 expected to graduate in 2016. In addition, he holds a professional FCC License, and
19 has received numerous telecommunications and information technology certifications.
20 In his spare time, Noel volunteers for the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam Program;
21 and

22 **WHEREAS**, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan began his military career in active
23 service as a Multichannel Communications Operator, in addition to Tactical Satellite
24 Communications Operation with the U.S. Army 125th Signal Battalion at Schofield
25 Barracks in Hawaii, where he served from December 1984 to December 1987; and
26 during his assignment there, he had participated in the "Team Spirit" exercises
27 throughout the countryside in South Korea; and

1 **WHEREAS**, from January 1988 to September 1989, CW3 Noel T.
2 Camaganacan served as the Multichannel Communications Team Chief with the U.S.
3 Army Reserves 804th Signal Company at Fort DeRussy, Hawaii; and he then went on
4 to become a Signal Communications Chief with the U.S. Army Reserves 411th
5 Engineer Battalion at Fort Shafter Flats, Hawaii, where he served from October 1989
6 to March 1992; and

7 **WHEREAS**, in January 1993, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan joined the Guam
8 Army National Guard as a Service Detachment Radio Repairer, and remained in this
9 position until August 1999. Eventually, he was assigned to work in the Directorate of
10 Information Management Department (DOIM); and from September 1999 to October
11 2002, he was with the NBC NCO Service Detachment; and

12 **WHEREAS**, from November 2002 to August 2003, CW3 Noel T.
13 Camaganacan attended the Warrant Officer Candidate Course and graduated in 2002;
14 and he then became a full time Active Guard Member in 2003; and

15 **WHEREAS**, from July 2003 to April 2006, as a Warrant Officer 1, CW3 Noel
16 T. Camaganacan carried out his assignments in the Directorate of Information
17 Management Department, where he managed the Guam National Guard's personnel
18 and information systems assets associated Automated Information Systems (AIS), and
19 Internet Protocol (IP) Local Area Networks (LANs). He performed system integration
20 and developed software installation plans, and also planned and developed the
21 Information Systems Life Cycle Management. CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan also
22 conducted systems analysis and design, development, implementation, and acceptance
23 testing; he created and implemented Information Assurance Plans; he performed
24 systems administration and LAN administration of AIS; he managed the training of
25 personnel in the installation, operation, and administration of AIS, Intranets,
26 telecommunications, and video conferencing systems; he provided technical
27 guidance and direction to all Guam National Guard Units; he developed policy and

1 guidance for the management of all LAN and information systems at all levels of
2 echelons; and he performed the duties of a J6 Deputy and Budget Officer; and

3 **WHEREAS**, in 2004, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan graduated from Warrant
4 Officer Basic Course-Information Systems Technician at Fort Gordon, Georgia; and
5 he was promoted to Chief Warrant Officer Two. Later, from May 2006 to May 2007,
6 he was deployed under Operation Enduring Freedom to the Horn of Africa, Camp
7 Lemonier, Djibouti. While serving there he was required to oversee military to
8 military training and convoy operations at the contingency operations locations in
9 Hurso and Bilate in Ethiopia. He was responsible for ensuring the maintenance and
10 operation of over one thousand (1,000) network routing devices for the secure and
11 non-secure Internet networks and coalition network computer systems, which
12 involved troubleshooting and maintaining computer firewalls to prevent cyber attacks
13 from gaining access into sensitive military information; and his additional work
14 included the design and configuration of the virtual local area network (VLAN) to
15 optimize efficiency. During his duties in Ethiopia, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan
16 worked closely with the Ethiopian Special Forces Commander to ensure mission
17 objectives were accomplished; and

18 **WHEREAS**, in 2008, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan graduated from Warrant
19 Officer Advance Course-Information Systems Technician at Fort Gordon, Georgia,
20 and was later promoted to the rank of Chief Warrant Officer Three. In 2011, he
21 graduated from Warrant Officer Staff Course at Fort Rucker, Alabama. While at this
22 rank, he continued with his duties in the DOIM Department with the Guam Army
23 National Guard, where he was assigned to serve as the Information Assurance
24 Manager (IAM), and where he developed, maintained, implemented, and enforced a
25 formal J/G6 approved IA security and training program; he ensured the
26 implementation of periodic security inspections, assessments, tests, and reviews; he
27 reviewed all IA support documentation packages and system fielding to ensure

1 accuracy and completeness, and that they met minimal risk acceptance standards; he
2 ensured that all information systems within the Guam Army National Guard are
3 properly certified and accredited in accordance with DITSCAP and configuration
4 management policies before authorizing the use of hardware and software on
5 GUARDNET XXI; he developed policy recommendations and provided technical
6 guidance for the planning, managing and troubleshooting of Army, joint, and
7 combined networks; he advised commanders and staffs on tactical
8 telecommunications network requirements for Director of Information Management or
9 G6. His additional duties included, but was not limited to, scanning the network with
10 approved tools such as Active Directory, Window System Update Server (WSUS),
11 RETINA, MS System Center Configuration Manager (SCCM), Host Base Security
12 System (HBSS), and Symantec Anti-Virus Server; and

13 **WHEREAS**, from August 2012 to August 2013, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan
14 deployed once again to Forward Operating Base Joint Regional Afghan Compound
15 (JRAC), and Lindsay, Kandahar, Afghanistan, as part of a thirteen (13) man Security
16 Forces Advisory Team (SFAT); and he was the S6 Signal Officer Advisor for the
17 Afghan National Civil Order Police (ANCOP) Brigade (BDE), where he provided
18 guidance and counseling to the ANCOP BDE Signal Officer on procurement, repair,
19 and effective use of their communications equipment assets. In addition, he ensured
20 that the SFAT team communications equipment was in operational condition; he
21 coordinated and installed COMSEC on all radio equipment; he ensured that all vehicle
22 equipment, such as the Boomerang, Blue Force Tracker, Dagger, HF and VHF radios,
23 are operational; he coordinated with contractors to ensure that all communications
24 were properly repaired; he was the contracted officer and pay agent; and he was the
25 Information Management Officer (IMO) on computer and network issues in three
26 major enclaves. Towards the end of his tour, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan was
27 reassigned to serve as the Contractor Officer Representative (COR) advisor to the

1 205th Coalition Advisory Team (CAT), consisting of Bulgarian and Polish led under
2 the auspices of the Australian Army, to provide mentorship to the Afghan National
3 Army Contracting Team; and

4 **WHEREAS**, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan’s extensive military educational
5 background includes: completion of the U.S. Army Basic Training at Fort Jackson,
6 South Carolina, on February 27, 1985; the U.S. Army Multichannel Communications
7 Equipment Operator Course, where he was an Honor Graduate, at Fort Gordon,
8 Georgia, on June 13, 1985; the U.S. Army “Tropic Thunder” Divarty Leadership
9 Course at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, on December 16, 1986; the U.S. Army Radio
10 Repairer Course 101-29E10 at Fort Gordon, Georgia, on October 4, 1994; the U.S.
11 Army Primary Leadership Development Course at Camp Williams, Utah, on February
12 11, 1995; the U.S. Army Radio Fundamentals Course 35E on August 20, 1997; the
13 U.S. Army Chemical School 54B20/30 Phase I at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, on
14 August 20, 1999; the U.S. Army Chemical School 54B/20/30 Phase II at Fort
15 McClellan, Montana, on August 26, 2000; the U.S. Army Warrant Officer Candidate
16 Course (WOCC) at Fort Rucker, Alabama, on November 15, 2002; the U.S. Army
17 Warrant Officer Basic Course (WOBC) 251A-Information Systems Technician at Fort
18 Gordon, Georgia, on April 8, 2004; the ST7000 Action Officer Development Course
19 (AODC) on September 8, 2005; the U.S. Army Warrant Officer Advance Course
20 (WOAC) 251A-Information Systems Technician at Fort Gordon, Georgia, on August
21 8, 2008; and the U.S. Army Warrant Officer Staff Course (WOSC) at Fort Rucker,
22 Alabama, on May 13, 2011; and

23 **WHEREAS**, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan’s major awards and decorations
24 include: the Joint Meritorious Unit Citation; the Meritorious Unit Citation; the Bronze
25 Star Medal; the Meritorious Service Medal (with 1 Oak Leaf Cluster); the Army
26 Achievement Medal; the Army Good Conduct Medal; the Reserve Components
27 Achievement Medal (with 3 Bronze Oak Leafs); the National Defense Service Medal

1 (with 1 Bronze Star); the Afghanistan Campaign Medal (with 1 Bronze Star); the War
2 on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal; the War on Terrorism Service Medal; the
3 Humanitarian Service Medal; the Armed Forces Reserve Medal (with M Device and
4 Silver Hour Glass); the NCO Professional Development Ribbon (with Numeral 2); the
5 Army Service Ribbon; the Overseas Service Ribbon (with Numeral 2); the Reserve
6 Components Overseas Training Ribbon; the NATO Medal; the Guam Commendation
7 Medal (with Bronze Oak Leaf); the Guam Faithful Service Medal (with Bronze Oak
8 Leaf); three (3) Overseas Service Bars; and the Shoulder Sleeve Insignia for Central
9 Command, 2nd ID, 3rd ID, and 29th ID; and


10 **WHEREAS**, CW3 Noel T. Camaganacan's civilian affiliations include the

22 U.S. Secretaries of the Army and Air Force, effective June 11, 2015; and be it further


23 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
