1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I***
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÁHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS, *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guáhan*, on behalf of the**

1 people of Guam, joins the rest of the nation in remembering the horrific attacks
2 against our country which occurred on September 11, 2001; and

3 **WHEREAS**, nearly three thousand (3,000) innocent civilians were killed in the
4 heinous attacks of September 11, 2001; and fourteen (14) years later, the people of the
5 United States and from around the world continue to mourn the tremendous loss of
6 innocent lives on that fateful day; and

7 **WHEREAS**, in 2009, the U.S. Congress and the President joined together to
8 designate September 11 as a “National Day of Service and Remembrance” under the
9 Serve America Act (Public Law 111–13; 123 Stat. 1460); and

10 **WHEREAS**, in September 2009 and September 2010, President Obama issued
11 Proclamation 8413 (74 Fed. Reg. 47045) and Proclamation 8559 (75 Fed. Reg. 56463)
12 proclaiming September 11, 2009, and September 11, 2010, respectively, as “Patriot
13 Day” and the “National Day of Service and Remembrance”; and

14 **WHEREAS**, *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, on behalf of the
15 people of Guam, wants to honor those who have gone above and beyond the call of
16 duty in their service to our community; and

17 **WHEREAS**, through the leadership and vision of Mrs. Cecilia A.Q. Morrison,
18 former Deputy Director of the Bureau of Women’s Affairs, the AmeriCorps program
19 was launched on Guam in June 1995 through the Office of the Governor, Federal
20 Programs Office; and

21 **WHEREAS**, in 1998, the AmeriCorps program on Guam was restructured and
22 centrally administered by the Governor’s Community Outreach, Federal Programs
23 Office, with volunteers recruited at three (3) placement sites, including, the
24 Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Youth Affairs, and the Guam
25 Public Library System. Through Executive Order No. 2005-22, the Governor’s Serve

1 Guam! Commission was established to oversee, administer and manage the
2 AmeriCorps programs under the purview of the Office of the Governor of Guam; and

3 **WHEREAS**, AmeriCorps programs across the United States engage more than
4 seventy-five thousand (75,000) Americans in intensive service each year at nonprofits,
5 schools, public agencies, and community and faith-based groups. Since 1994, more
6 than nine hundred thousand (900,000) AmeriCorps members have contributed more
7 than 1.2 billion hours in service across the country, while tackling pressing problems
8 and mobilizing millions of volunteers for the organizations they serve; and

9 **WHEREAS**, since 2005, the Governor’s Serve Guam! Commission-Guam
10 AmeriCorps has received more than 14 Million Dollars from the Corporation for
11 National and Community Service to support the creation of jobs and to provide
12 meaningful pathways to opportunities for Guam’s young adults entering the
13 workforce. This significant investment has helped more than one thousand five
14 hundred (1,500) young adults to learn valuable work skills, earn money for education,
15 and develop an appreciation for their citizenship; now therefore, be it

16 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na*
17 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people
18 of Guam, recognize the observance of the “National Day of Service and
19 Remembrance” on September 11, 2015, in honor of the victims of the September 11,
20 2001 attacks on the United States; and does further commemorate the observance of
21 the 21st Year Anniversary of the founding of AmeriCorps, which inspired the spirit of
22 compassion and generosity that followed, notably the generations of service that
23 continue to be supported by the leadership, participants, and community partners of
24 the Governor’s Serve Guam! Commission-Guam AmeriCorps, and congratulate them
25 as they join their counterparts across the United States in celebrating twenty-one (21)
26 years of service to our nation during the month of September 2015; and be it further

1 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
2 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
3 the same be thereafter transmitted to Mrs. Cecilia A.Q. Morrison; to Ms. Doris
4 Aguon, Executive Director, Governor's Serve Guam! Commission; to the members of
5 the Governor's Serve Guam! Commission-Guam AmeriCorps; and to the Honorable
6 Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*.


