- WHEREAS, H.R. 9, also known as the "Innovation Act," was introduced in the
- 4 114th United States Congress, and is sponsored by Representative Bob Goodlatte, a

- 1 Republican from Virginia's 6th Congressional District and Chairman of the United
- 2 States House of Representatives Committee on the Judiciary; and
- 3 WHEREAS, H.R. 9 has been co-sponsored by a bipartisan coalition of twenty-
- 4 seven (27) representatives, including Representative Darrell Issa (R-CA),
- 5 Representative Lamar Smith (R-TX), Representative Steve Chabot (R-OH),
- 6 Representative Randy Forbes (R-VA), Representative Zoe Lofgren (D-CA),
- 7 Representative Jerrold Nadler (D-NY), Delegate Pedro Pierluisi (D-PR), and
- 8 Representative Hakeem Jeffries (D-NY), who are all senior members of the United
- 9 States House of Representatives Committee on the Judiciary; and
- 10 WHEREAS, H.R. 9 has been endorsed by leading technology groups, such as
- 11 the Electronic Frontier Foundation, United for Patent Reform, and the Biotechnology
- 12 Industry Association; by leading companies like Yahoo!, Eli Lily, and
- 13 Salesforce.com; as well as by groups representing small businesses throughout the
- 14 country, including the National Association of Realtors, and the Texas Hotel and
- 15 Lodging Association; and
- 16 WHEREAS, under the current patent system many broad and basic
- 17 technological protocols have been issued vague patents, including the use of drop
- down menus, shopping carts and hyper-linking on websites. Companies have bought
- 19 up these patents with the intent of using them offensively against unsuspecting
- 20 businesses, making broad claims of infringement based upon patents of questionable
- 21 validity; and
- WHEREAS, the most frequent target of patent lawsuits have been small
- businesses because of their inability to spend the money necessary for a defense and
- 24 therefore their increased likelihood to settle; and
- WHEREAS, any business on Guam could be targeted with these costly patent
- 26 lawsuits that create an environment that stifles Guam's economic development and

prosperity by creating a chilling effect on businesses that seek to create an internet presence for the benefit of the business and the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, local business owners in the real estate community on Guam have sought *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*'s support for H.R. 9, the "Innovation Act," because many of them use websites with search functions, drop down menus, and other internet protocols, which may be the subject of abusive litigation and affect critical business and community functions; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the 33rd Guam Legislature) does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, implore the 114th U.S. Congress to duly pass H.R. 9, the "Innovation Act," for the benefit of all businesses that wish to contribute to the positive economic growth of their community; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam Delegate to the U.S. Congress; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*.
