1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, in 2014, Guam lost twenty-nine (29) lives by suicide. That is 4 about one death every two weeks, a rate that has remained the same for the past 5 decade; and

l WHEREAS, in our diverse population, suicide risks are highest among teens 2 and young adults; three (3) in every five (5) suicide deaths are of those aged thirty 3 (30) years and younger; and

4 WHEREAS, the risk of suicide exists in multiple layers, with the impact of each suicide death on family members, friends and other individuals. Every day, we 5 encounter individuals who are fighting for strength and courage to cope and continue 6 7 to live despite their pain and loss; and

8 WHEREAS, with help, there is hope. Guam has seen a growing number of 9 trained community gatekeepers - those who have been trained in evidence-based 10 trainings on suicide prevention, intervention and postvention. These gatekeepers are regular individuals with an extraordinary willingness to help others whose lives are at 11 12 risk. They are counselors, teachers, nurses and doctors who are willing to go beyond 13 the surface in caring for their students and patients. They are also parents, siblings, 14 best friends, classmates and coworkers who are concerned about their loved ones. Suicide is a tough subject to talk about, but they took on the challenge of surpassing 15 16 the shame and taboo associated with it; and

WHEREAS, suicide is becoming everyone's business. As of early 2015, there 17 18 are over three thousand (3,000) individuals who are trained in suicide prevention and Trainings such as safeTALK, ASIST and Connect continue to be 19 first aid skills. 20 offered to the island community through the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness 21 Center and its partner agencies, including: the UOG I Pinangon Campus Suicide 22 Prevention Center, the Inafa'maolek Mediation Center, the Guam Department of 23 Education (GDOE), the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), 24 the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), and the Guam Army National 25 Guard; and

1 WHEREAS, various resources for help are growing to address the issue of suicide on various levels in Guam's community. The Lifelines training will be 2 launched this school year, a three (3)-tier curriculum that involves the school 3 4 administration, teachers, counselors, support staff and students in creating and sustaining a suicide-safer school environment. The first community-led Survivors of 5 6 Suicide Support Group will be hosted on October 8, 2015, where all persons who have experienced the loss of a loved one to suicide can partake in an experience that may 7 8 help in their healing journey; and

9 WHEREAS, September is "National Suicide Prevention Month." This month 10 and throughout the year, we are all reminded that we all can do our part in stopping 11 suicide on Guam. We all can take an active role in saving a life: by learning more 12 about suicide and its warnings signs, by supporting someone who might be at risk for 13 suicide, and by reaching out and asking for help; and

WHEREAS, the Guam community is a believer that *behavioral health is essential to health*. As much as we take care of our physical fitness, we must also prioritize our mental health and emotional well-being. It takes strength for an individual to face and admit emotional pain; and it takes courage to stand up and ask for help and support; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Tres Na 19 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people 20 of Guam, recognize and commend the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center 21 22 (GBHW) Prevention and Training Branch (PEACE Office), the University of Guam I 23 Pinangon Campus Suicide Prevention Program, and Rainbows for All Children on the commemoration of "National Suicide Prevention Month"; and does further extend a 24 25 sincere Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to these organizations for their dedication, commitment and service to the people of Guam; and be it further 26
