Relative to recognizing and commending the Saint Francis of Assisi Catholic Church on the special occasion of its One Hundredth ( $100^{\text{th}}$ ) Year Anniversary – "Celebrating 100 Years of Catholicism and Catholic Service in *Yona*" (1915-2015); and to further extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the Saint Francis Church for the tremendous public service that it provides for the people of the beautiful village of *Yona* and the island community.

## 1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, from 1915 to 1941, the Navarran Capuchins oversaw an 4 admirable period of expansion of the Guam Catholic Mission. One of the highlights of their success included the extension of the Mission's personnel, churches, and
 religious organizations; and

WHEREAS, in the early 1900s, only twenty (20) families, consisting of about one hundred (100) people resided in the village of *Yona*, which was known to be a farming community. In 1914, *Pale* Luis De Leon felt a chapel in *Yona* was necessary, so that the small community could celebrate Mass at least once a month; and

WHEREAS, by 1915, occasional services were held in this modest chapel,
which was made of wood and pandanas, unfortunately no photo exists of this chapel;
and

WHEREAS, as it was built by the Capuchins, the *Yona* chapel was named after
their founder, Saint Francis of Assisi; and

WHEREAS, the village started to grow as the residents of *Hagåtña* who owned farms in *Yona* decided to reside there permanently. In 1924, the old chapel was replaced with a chapel made of stone and tin roofing; and Masses were still held there only once a month by one of the *Hagåtña* priests, *Pale* Javier; and

WHEREAS, in the 1930s, the village population grew to about seven hundred (700) residents; and in 1938, a new concrete church was built which most of us have seen because it survived World War II; and in 1941, the statue of Saint Francis of Assisi above the front door of the Church was made on Guam by the late Father Marcian Pelett; and

WHEREAS, the Spanish Capuchins in *Hagåtña* increased the number of
Masses held in *Yona* to every Sunday, and also held classes with the *Eskuelan Pale*.
During the war, the Masses were suspended because of the absence of the
Missionaries; but thankfully, the *Yona* Church survived the war; and

1 WHEREAS, after the war, Father Cyril Langheim was the first American 2 Capuchin assigned to the Church; and during that time the chapel needed some fixing 3 up, but it was still usable for most Church services; and

WHEREAS, the real story of how the parish grew from a small provincial 4 chapel to a complete parish complex began with Father Alvin La Feir. Father Alvin 5 6 was a dynamic spirited priest who had big dreams for his parish. He saw that the ever 7 growing community needed a larger Church and its own parochial school; and

8 WHEREAS, Father Alvin was an expert at getting donations of money and 9 supplies from the local people, the military, and friends from his hometown of Detroit; 10 and

11 WHEREAS, a new larger Church, a school, and a convent for the teaching 12 sisters were planned. A typhoon in 1958 delayed the construction, but Father Alvin 13 and his parishioners were persistent and moved ahead, and they never gave up; and

14 WHEREAS, the parishioners of Yona raised funds in every possible way and 15 they volunteered their time and energy in the completion of the Church; and

16 WHEREAS, in February 1962, the new Church which we still use today was 17 finally dedicated to the delight and pride of the hardworking parishioners of Yona; and

18 WHEREAS, the famous paintings found on the walls of the Church which 19 depict the life of Saint Francis of Assisi were done by Father Marcian Pelett. Those 20 paintings were finished and dedicated in the church right before one of the worst 21 typhoons to hit Guam. Supertyphoon Karen blew the roof off the church in November 22 1962, exposing the interior to wind and rain. The village and the Church went under extensive development and picked up again; and 23

24 WHEREAS, in 1966, Father Alvin La Feir died, and his funeral was attended by thousands of residents. He was the first American Capuchin Priest to be buried on 25 26 Guam. He is known to have laid the foundation for everything that the Saint Francis Parish eventually became, and a bust in his memory, that was built by the parish, sits
 in the front of the Church; and

WHEREAS, after Father Alvin came Father Fulgence Petri, then Father Daniel
Cristobal who started the Religious Goods Store that *Yona* was known for, as this was
the place to buy the *Chamorro* novena books; and

WHEREAS, in 1975, Father Paul L. Minchak was assigned for a year as
associate pastor and then returned to the Mainland to be novice master and superior of
Capuchin communities in Massachusetts and New York; and

9 WHEREAS, then came Father George Maddock who famously changed the
10 altar boy cassocks to brown like the Patron Saint of the parish; and

WHEREAS, later, Father Michael Dalton was assigned to minister in *Yona*, and he continued the development of the parish, enhancing the parish council and religious education programs; and

14 WHEREAS, Father Felixberto Leon Guerrero, who had to deal with multiple 15 natural disasters that damaged the Church, also did what he had to do to continue on 16 with Church services and programs; and

WHEREAS, in 1994, Father Patrick Castro joined the parish and addressed the
structural damage caused by past natural disasters. The Church was then renovated
and air-condition was installed for the first time; and

WHEREAS, after Father Patrick left, Father Joseph English presided and kept
 the parish life strong and vibrant; and

WHEREAS, Father Jose Villagomez became the next pastor and he continued the spiritual care of the parish until his retirement; and Father Andre Eduvala most recently began his ministry with the parish; and

WHEREAS, the Saint Francis of Assisi Catholic Church remains a spiritual source of blessing for the people of Yona and the island community, something that can be appreciated for many years to come. *Biba Saint Francis! Biba Yona!*; now
 therefore, be it

3 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Tres Na 4 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people 5 of Guam, recognize and commend the Saint Francis of Assisi Catholic Church on the 6 special occasion of its One Hundredth (100th) Year Anniversary – "Celebrating 100 Years of Catholicism and Catholic Service in Yona" (1915-2015); and does further 7 extend Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to the Saint Francis Church for the 8 9 tremendous public service that it provides for the people of the beautiful village of 10 *Yona* and the island community; and be it further

11 **RESOLVED,** that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules 12 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of 13 the same be thereafter transmitted to the Saint Francis of Assisi Catholic Church 14 Parish; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga 'låhen Guåhan*.
