Relative to recognizing the observance of World AIDS Day on December 1, 2015; and to further extending a warm and sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the Guam HIV Planning Group (HPG), Guam's Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA), WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI), and the University of Guam's Introduction to Community Services (SW-110) and Generalist Social Work Practice Methods (SW-331) students for strengthening Guam's community response to HIV and continuing to mobilize our island's efforts in the fight against HIV.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

- WHEREAS, it is the custom of the Guam Legislature to acknowledge official
- 4 days that are set aside to increase awareness of serious issues that affect the lives of
- 5 the people of Guam; and

WHEREAS, attendant to such concern, and in full accord with its long-standing traditions, this Legislative Body is moved to recognize the observance of World AIDS Day on Tuesday, December 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is observed on December 1 every year, bringing together people from around the world to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS; and since 1995, the President of the United States of America has made an official proclamation on World AIDS Day; and

WHEREAS, World AIDS Day is an opportunity for public and private partners to spread awareness about the status of the pandemic and to encourage progress in HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment, and care on Guam and around the world; and

WHEREAS, initiated by the United Nations and first held in 1988, World AIDS Day was the first ever declared global health day; and commemorating the day presents an opportunity to demonstrate international solidarity in the face of the pandemic; and

WHEREAS, HIV/AIDS continues to be a major global public health issue: the disease has claimed more than twenty-five million (25,000,000) lives over the past three (3) decades, making it one of the most destructive epidemics in recorded history; and

WHEREAS, there are close to one million two hundred thousand (1,200,000) Americans living with HIV infection, and an estimated fifty thousand (50,000) new HIV infections occurring each year. On Guam, there have been two hundred fifty-three (253) cases of HIV infections reported since 1985, and there are approximately sixty-seven (67) people currently living with HIV; and

WHEREAS, in alignment with the National HIV/AIDS Strategy (NHAS), the Guam HIV Planning Group (HPG), whose mission is "to identify new HIV infections and reduce HIV-related disparities through the collaboration and coordination of prevention, care, and treatment services on our island," plays a critical role in the

- 1 seamless coordination of partnerships of public and private organizations, such as:
- 2 WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI); Guam's Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA);
- 3 the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center; the Just Say No Dance Crew; the
- 4 University of Guam; the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services
- 5 Family Planning, Maternal Child Health, Immunization, and Tuberculosis Programs;
- 6 the Guam Department of Education; Sanctuary, Incorporated; the Oasis
- 7 Empowerment Center; the Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault and Family
- 8 Violence; the Salvation Army, and other community members; and
- 9 WHEREAS, to date, WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI) and Guam's Alternative
- 10 Lifestyle Association (GALA) are the only two (2) community-based organizations on
- 11 Guam that retain certified STD/HIV Prevention Counselors, and implement HIV
- 12 Rapid Testing and STD testing on Guam; and
- WHEREAS, local efforts are ongoing to promote greater access to treatment,
- including antiretroviral drugs, so that people living with HIV (PLWH) can continue to
- avail of the HIV continuum of care services and enjoy healthy and productive lives;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, given the substantial biological evidence demonstrating the
- 18 increased likelihood of both HIV transmission and acquisition in the presence of other
- 19 Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs) like chlamydia, gonorrhea and syphilis,
- 20 unprotected sex, already a proven risk factor for HIV transmission, must continue to
- 21 be addressed through cross collaboration among community stakeholders as an
- 22 important strategy to curb new HIV infections; and
- WHEREAS, although Guam is considered a low HIV prevalence area, local
- 24 efforts must be sustained to prevent an HIV epidemic. The HPG's role is to ensure
- 25 that the island's resources are directed to strengthen STD and HIV prevention and
- 26 care efforts. Additionally, HPG continues to ensure the provision of interventions to
- 27 key populations, such as men who have sex with men (MSM), injection drug users

(IDU), and pregnant women at risk for STDs, with a special focus on developing sexual reproductive health and responsibility programs and behavioral wellness programs among young people ages fifteen (15) to twenty-five (25); and

WHEREAS, public and private partnerships boost the island's efforts to respond to HIV by advocating for appropriately developed programs that promote sexual reproductive health and behavioral health and wellness, whose implementation is geared towards the eradication of AIDS; and

WHEREAS, as we observe World AIDS Day on December 1, this year's national theme of: "The Time to Act is Now" reminds us that our work is far from over and that now is an opportune time for us to recommit ourselves to push the pace of change, without ceasing, to create an AIDS-free generation; and

WHEREAS, the activities planned for Guam's observance of World AIDS Day 2015 would not be possible were it not for the collective efforts and commitment of the following organizations and individuals: WestCare Pacific Islands/GUAHAN Project, Guam's Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA), Guam HIV Planning Group (HPG), the University of Guam's Introduction to Community Services (SW-110) and Generalist Social Work Practice Methods (SW-331) students, and other community members; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize the observance of World AIDS Day on December 1, 2015, and extend its appreciation to the World AIDS Day 2015 Planning Committee, comprised of the Guam HIV Planning Group (HPG), WestCare Pacific Islands (WCPI), Guam's Alternative Lifestyle Association (GALA) and the University of Guam's Introduction to Community Services (SW-110) and Generalist Social Work Practice Methods (SW-331) students, on the organizing and planning of the World AIDS Day 2015 activities; and does further extend a warm and sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the
