Relative to recognizing and commending Jack B. Jones, FAIA, for his invaluable contributions to the people of Guam, especially in the area of architecture and historic preservation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I*MINA'TRENTALTRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

- WHEREAS, Jack B. Jones, FAIA, was born on May 14, 1944, in Keokuk,
- 4 Iowa. He attended Iowa State University, graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in
- 5 Architecture. Mr. Jones arrived on Guam in 1970 as a Naval Officer for the U.S.
- 6 Navy OICC, Marianas. In 1972, Jones worked for the firm, Haver, Nunn & Nelson
- 7 Architects, AIA, which had offices in Phoenix, Arizona, and Guam. Jones would then
- 8 become the Resident Manager for the firm of Alfred A. Yee & Associates Inc. from

1975 to 1977. Mr. Jones married Luchie R. Jones, and together they were blessed with eight (8) children, twenty-four (24) grandchildren, and four (4) great grandchildren; and he currently resides in Golden, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, in his early career, Mr. Jones spent much of his spare time sketching in the southern villages of Guam. His interest in the traditional life of an island community became a heavy influence for Jones, reflecting the vernacular traditional forms of the *Inarajan* village homes in his architecture. Mr. Jones was first introduced to the village when he managed the *Inarajan* Junior High School project under Yee's office. He spent countless hours compiling data that would be used in nominating the *Inarajan* Village Architectural Historical District to the National Register of Historic Places, which was accomplished in 1977. Mr. Jones continued to be instrumental in the recordation and documentation of Guam's unique historical architecture, raising public awareness of the historic and cultural significance of the pre-war era villages; and

WHEREAS, his contributions to the community would continue, with Mr. Jones serving as Chairman of the Guam Historic Preservation Trust and Review Board, which remains at the forefront of preservation efforts throughout the island. As a passionate advocate in the advancement of the architectural profession's standard of practice, he served on the Guam Board of Registration for Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors (PEALS) from 1986 to 1995 as a Board Member and Vice Chairman; and

WHEREAS, as a liaison to the National Council for Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB), Mr. Jones extended his professional affiliations with the Council, serving in the Exam Committee to grade the pencil-and-paper registration exams. He offered valuable insight to a generation of interns and his Philippine colleagues who have acquired experience through longstanding practice, many of whom had successfully passed the registration exam. Jones also heavily emphasized obtaining

1 NCARB certification upon licensure, or as he would refer to as the "blue jacket",

2 which would allow Guam based architects to obtain reciprocity to practice in other

3 jurisdictions. The path to licensure required education, experience and examination,

in which he would have added a fourth component: ethics; and

WHEREAS, today, and throughout his architectural practice, Mr. Jones continues to live by the Ethical Code of Conduct, mindful of the oath taken over forty (40) years ago to safeguard public health, safety and welfare, and to serve the public interest. In 1997, the American Institute of Architects (AIA), Guam/Micronesia Chapter, presented Mr. Jones with a Silver Anniversary Chapter Commendation for promoting the highest standards of practice and development in the architectural profession; for always aspiring to design excellence, creative experimentation and respect for context; for representing the Chapter in the United States and abroad, always serving with integrity and passion; and for believing in the potential of the islands and this community, guiding new generations of architects to aspire to professional and design excellence; and

WHEREAS, the commendation still holds true almost two (2) decades later as a partner with Provido Tan Jones Architects Inc. Mr. Jones' other professional accomplishments include being the co-editor/co-author of two (2) published books: the *Guidebook to the Architecture of Guam* and *Energy-Conscious Design for A Tropical Isle*, published by the AIA, Guam/Micronesia Chapter; and with his contributions to architecture he was recognized with a nomination and selection to the prestigious AIA College of Fellows; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize and commend Jack B. Jones, FAIA, for his countless and invaluable contributions to the people of Guam, especially in the areas of advancing

- 1 the architectural field of practice and promoting the historic preservation of Guam's
- 2 unique architectural landmarks; and be it further
- 3 **RESOLVED,** that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
