BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTALTRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÂHAN:

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Michael Aguero Reyes was born on April 21, 1962; and is the son of Vicente Blas Reyes and Martha Aguero Reyes from the beautiful village of *Agat*. His siblings are: George Reyes, Edward Reyes, Helen Reyes

- 1 Gumataotao and Barbara Reyes Twilliger; and he has three (3) children: JV Michael
- 2 (28), Zane Aaron (26) and Mahana Barbara-Jo (8); and
- 3 WHEREAS, in May 1980, Lieutenant Reyes graduated from George
- 4 Washington High School in Mangilao, Guam; and
- 5 WHEREAS, immediately after graduating from high school, Lieutenant Reyes
- 6 enlisted in the U.S. Army and attended Basic Training in Fort Knox, Kentucky. He
- 7 graduated with honors, received a full college scholarship and attended Kemper
- 8 Military College in Bonneville, Missouri. In 1982, he graduated from Kemper
- 9 Military College as a "Distinguished Military Graduate" and received a commission in
- the U.S. Army as a Second Lieutenant; and
- WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes returned to Guam and served honorably as
- 12 Commander for the 721st Signal Company with the Guam Army National Guard until
- 13 1994. His military awards include: the Guam Army National Guard Organizational
- 14 Medal, the Army Service Ribbon, the Parachutist Badge, the Army Commendation
- 15 Medal (Second Award), and the Army Achievement Medal; and
- WHEREAS, from 1985 through 1986, Lieutenant Reyes briefly worked for the
- 17 federal government at the Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office, and was
- 18 assigned to the Precious Metal Recovery Section; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes' government of Guam service began in
- 20 December 1986 with the Department of Agriculture, Division of Aquatic and Wildlife
- 21 Resources, where he worked as an Officer 1 in the Law Enforcement Section. He
- 22 graduated from the Guam Police Academy, 28th Police Cycle, and through hard work
- and dedication, Lieutenant Reyes worked his way up the ranks; and in 2006, he was
- promoted to his current rank and position. He served on numerous advisory panels

and commissions, to include the newly established Peace Officer Standards and

2 Training (POST) Commission; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes is recognized as the "subject matter expert" when it comes to conservation and resources enforcement. His knowledge and expertise in local and federal laws, rules, and regulations provided a better understanding between the government of Guam and the U.S. Department of Defense in the joint effort of improving our aquatic and wildlife environment; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes is a true leader who earned the respect of our neighboring islands when he supported the "Officer Exchange Program," allowing conservation officers from the Republic of Palau to train alongside local conservation officers to better enforce and manage their protected areas under the Micronesian Challenge; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes' exceptional knowledge in managing federal grants afforded the Department of Agriculture with the opportunity to receive approximately a half million dollars in federal funds that were used towards the purchase of new equipment and supplies, a brand new full size vehicle to tow patrol vessels, and the hiring of ten (10) additional Civilian Volunteer Conservation Officers. Additionally, when personnel were called to serve our country on active military duty, these grants afforded the hiring of three (3) limited term conservation officers. Today, these officers are full-time employees which resulted in boosting the morale of the section; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes' passion to serve the people of Guam was evident when he joined the "men in blue" of the Guam Police Department, serving as a member of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) Program from 1994 to the

- 2 Division, Marine Patrol, and Executive Security. His dedication to "preserve and
- 3 protect" made him a recipient of numerous awards and recognitions, to include: the
- 4 Distinguished Service Medal Award (3rd Award), the Life Saving Award, the
- 5 Meritorious Service Award, and numerous Letters of Commendation; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes' extensive law enforcement training, which
- 7 were completed on Guam and abroad, includes: SWAT Operator Certified, Advance
- 8 Officer Survival, Advance Officer Water Survival, Tactical Tracker Level 1 & 2, FBI
- 9 Long Rifle Marksmanship Training, Jet Ski/Boat Operator Certified, Boating
- 10 Accident Investigator, and Rigid Hull Inflatable Operator Training; and
- WHEREAS, Lieutenant Reyes continues to serve the people of Guam and the
- 12 community by volunteering in the Adopt-a-School campaign, Career Day, and the
- 13 Annual Guam Coastal Clean-up, and as a member of the Volunteer Conservation
- 14 Officer (VCO) Program at Andersen Air Force Base; now therefore, be it
