## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, Joyce I. Martratt was born in Hagåtña, Guam on August 28,
- 4 1939. Her loving parents are †Jesus San Nicolas and †Rosario Castro Camacho, and
- 5 she is the eldest of five (5) children. She will celebrate this milestone with her
- 6 husband, Charlie Martratt; her five (5) children: Herbert, Phillip, David, Michele, and
- 7 Timothy; and her wonderful grandchildren and great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Joyce's loving parents wanted to give their daughter a better life and education; and in 1955, Joyce's Uncle Jose "Peling" and his wife Maria Castro adopted her. She then became Joyce I. Castro. It was a difficult time for her, but she asked no questions and did what her parents wanted her to do. A new chapter in her life began, and Joyce and her adopted family, Aunt-Mother Maria, and her cousins Joseph and †Eddie left the island to join Uncle-Father Peling in Washington, D.C. She was enrolled at St. Cecilia's Private School for Girls and she had her first encounter with the Sisters of the Cross. She joined numerous clubs throughout high school, sharing many stories of Guam. During this time, she gained two (2) additional siblings, Larry and Lucille Ann. While in high school, Joyce's father, Jesus died, and it devastated her causing a void in her heart. Just before her high school graduation, she was notified that her grandfather had died; and again, it brought sadness to her life. She enrolled at Oakland Community College, where she took business courses; and she worked at Gallup Poll to pay for business school; and

WHEREAS, Joyce had to return home to Guam because her mother needed her, and Guam was a welcome sight. She enrolled at the University of Guam and took general courses, and she had always wanted to become a teacher. In the path of this endeavor, a Navy man she had dated came to Guam, and he walked from *Dededo* to *Mongmong* to pursue his quest of her hand in marriage. Arrangements were made and Herbert Sablan Leddy and Joyce I. Castro were married. This union brought into the world five (5) beautiful children, and Joyce continued school after having their first child; and

WHEREAS, after a year serving at sea duty during the Vietnam War, Herbert returned home limping and in pain. He was diagnosed with a life changing illness, and Joyce applied to work at Anderson Air Force Base Guam (AAFB), where she was

able to get a temporary job at the Civilian Personnel Office; and since then, she has been detailed to various units at AAFB; and

WHEREAS, in February 1984, after many years of illness, Herbert passed away, and it was a great loss to the entire family. In mid-1985, Joyce was a member of the *Dededo* Municipal Planning Council, and she was assisting at the NCTS Navy Relief; and then Mayor Patricia Quinata introduced her to CMC Charlie Martratt. This led to memorable dinners and dances, and he was truly a most handsome man in that choker white with medals Navy uniform; and he was a gentleman and a scholar. Joyce was impressed with his knowledge of all topics and her admiration for him grew when she discovered he could fix anything. Above all, he treated her like a queen; and WHEREAS, on May 3, 1986, Charlie and Joyce were married at *Santa* Barbara Church by Monsignor Zoilo Camacho, Joyce's uncle. They became residents of *Malojloj* - a beautiful and quiet southern village. Charlie retired from the U.S. Navy in July 1986. At the 3rd Air Division, AAFB, Joyce placed her heart and soul into her job, working for each transitioning commander and vice commander until the Division moved to Hickam Air Force Base, Hawaii in May 1988; and

WHEREAS, Joyce has been blessed with having great leaders with the most talented young Airmen and civil servants throughout her career. She was privileged to have been a part of many major events with high ranking military officials, foreign officials and dignitaries; and

WHEREAS, Joyce sustained a superior performance throughout her fifty (50) year career; and she had received over two hundred (200) letters of appreciation for her involvement in numerous events, such as the Federal Women's POC; and as a member of the Asian Pacific Planning Committee and the annual Air Force Balls. She was a senior member and an officer on the Executive Committee of the Anderson

1 Civilian Advisory Council since 1975. Throughout her career and until this day she

2 continues to be a liaison with Guam's major agencies; and

WHEREAS, and now fifty (50) years later, the question that lingers is: "When

is Joyce retiring?" Her answer is: "she'll know when the time comes or when she can
