**Relative to posthumously recognizing and honoring the late
Juan Cruz Tenorio for his commitment to faithfully serving
our island and our country.**

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN***
2 ***GUÁHAN*:**

3 **WHEREAS,** Juan C. Tenorio (affectionately known as “Juan”) was born on
4 May 8, 1937; and is the son of †Alberto Camacho Tenorio and †Rita Duenas Cruz
5 Tenorio. He was raised in the village of *Garapan* in Saipan until he moved to Guam
6 to attend school; and he later graduated from Father Dueñas Memorial High School in
7 1957, and went on to earn his Bachelor of Civil Engineering degree from Marquette
8 University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in 1962; and he was also commissioned as a
9 Second Lieutenant in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Juan began a new chapter in his life when he married Charlene
2 Frances Dubiel from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, his wife for fifty-one (51) years; and
3 they were blessed with three (3) daughters - Juanita, Lisa, and Cristina; and

4 **WHEREAS**, after serving a two (2) year tour of active duty as a Platoon
5 Leader with the HQ, 92nd Engineer Battalion (Combat) at Fort Bragg, North Carolina,
6 Juan was honorably discharged from active duty on November 28, 1964; and he
7 continued his military service for the next thirty (30) years as a citizen-soldier through
8 the U.S. Army Reserve (USAR) program until his retirement in June 1992, retiring as
9 a Colonel (O-6). During his tenure, Juan successfully completed his military education
10 prerequisites, to include the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, Defense
11 Strategy Course from the U.S. Army War College, and the USAF Air War College
12 Seminar Program; and

13 **WHEREAS**, most notable in Juan's military service contributions was his
14 contributions to the expansion and development of the U.S. Army Reserve program
15 on Guam and the CNMI, a program which has provided hundreds of our men and
16 women from Guam and the CNMI who separate from active duty the opportunity to
17 continue their military service as citizen-soldiers; and

18 **WHEREAS**, Juan was a professionally licensed civil engineer. After serving as
19 the Director of the Government of Guam Department of Public Works from 1969 to
20 1971, Juan opened and operated his own private engineering firm; and for forty-one
21 (41) years, he served as the President, CEO, Principal Engineer, and General Manager
22 for the Guam and CNMI branches of the firm. His firm's principal areas of
23 engineering included master planning, and engineering related consulting services in
24 Guam, the CNMI, the Republic of Belau, the Federated States of Micronesia, and the
25 Republic of the Marshall Islands; and

26 **WHEREAS**, Juan was also very civic minded and contributed a large amount
27 of his time and talent to the community, to include being the founding Chairman of

1 the Board of Trustees of the Guam Community College (1978-1982); Chairman of the
2 Legislative Committee on Super Ports (1978); Member and Chairman of the Board of
3 Registration for Professional Engineers, Architects, and Licensed Surveyors (1969-
4 1994); Member of the Governor's Apprenticeship Development Committee (1977);
5 Member and Vice-Chairman of the Pacific Region Post Secondary Education Council
6 (1980-1982); and an active donor of the Guam Little League, the Guam Bambino
7 League, and Guam Babe Ruth League baseball teams; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Juan has received numerous awards and recognition from the
9 Guam and CNMI Legislatures, the National Committee for Employer Support of the
10 Guard and Reserves, the Marquette University School of Engineering for Professional
11 Achievement, and the U.S. Army Hawaii for his outstanding contributions to the
12 USAR Program; and

13 **WHEREAS**, Juan C. Tenorio will be fondly remembered as a loving and
14 generous man who was always willing to assist others; now therefore, be it


15 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby,
