Relative to recognizing and honoring the late Honorable Dr. Franklin Joseph Arceo Quitugua, former Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and Director of the Department of Education, for his service, dedication, and contributions to the people and island of Guam as an educator, legislator, and generous public servant; and to further expressing the sincerest condolences of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam to the family of the late Honorable Dr. Franklin J.A. Quitugua on his passing.

1BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I2MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Dr. Franklin J.A. Quitugua was born on Guam
on November 6, 1933; and is the son of Ignacio Perez Quitugua, Guam Congress

Assemblyman, and Rosa Santos Arceo Quitugua; and as a young man, he experienced
 the Japanese occupation of Guam and the eventual liberation of Guam by American
 military forces in World War II; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Quitugua married Julie Jane Siguenza Quitugua on July 27,
1957; and together they were blessed with five children: Clare, Franklin Jr.,
Evangeline, Mark, and Jacqueline; and

WHEREAS, upon graduating from George Washington High School in 1952,
Dr. Quitugua attended Northern Arizona University, majoring in Business Education
with a minor in English; and in 1956, he received a Bachelor's of Science Degree in
Education; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Quitugua returned to Guam and taught business education at
George Washington High School until 1961, at which time he returned to Northern
Arizona University and successfully earned his Master of Arts Degree in Secondary
Education Administration in 1962; and

WHEREAS, from 1972 through 1975, Dr. Quitugua continued to further his education by attending graduate school at the University of Oregon, where he received his Doctoral Degree in Educational Administration with a minor emphasis in Curriculum and Instruction, Anthropology, and Education; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Quitugua was a career educator, having taught business in secondary education for five years; and he later served as Principal of George Washington Junior High School, which is now named Agueda I. Johnston Middle School, until 1968, when he was appointed to serve as an Administrative Assistant to the Director of the Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Quitugua quickly rose through the ranks at the Department of
 Education and eventually served as the Deputy Director of Education; and in 1969,

Governor Manuel Guerrero appointed Dr. Quitugua to serve as Director of Education,
 a position in which he continued to serve under Governor Carlos Camacho; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Quitugua continued to serve as the Director of Education until 1976, at which time he resigned to make a successful run for a seat as Senator in the 14th Guam Legislature, his first attempt at seeking elected public office, eventually serving what would turn out to be the first of seven consecutive terms; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure in the Legislature, Dr. Quitugua served as
Chairman of the Committee on Education for three terms, and he was ultimately
elected by his legislative colleagues to serve as the Speaker of the 19th Guam
Legislature; and

11 WHEREAS, the extensive list of Dr. Quitugua's legislative accomplishments 12 includes helping strengthen the island's educational system by authoring laws that provided the funding necessary to build new schools and classrooms for the 13 14 Department of Education, and the funding necessary to expand and improve the facilities at the University of Guam and the Guam Community College. Additionally, 15 16 Dr. Quitugua was instrumental in helping lay the foundation for the Department of Education to incorporate Chamorro language and alternative education programs in 17 18 the public school system; and

WHEREAS, after his time as a member of the Guam Legislature, Dr. Quitugua
 was appointed by Governor Joseph Ada to return to the helm of the Department of
 Education, and retired as its Director in 1993; and

WHEREAS, after decades of distinguished public service as an educator and legislator, Dr. Quitugua continued his service to the island as a member of the University of Guam Board of Regents and the University of Guam Endowment Foundation, in which he continued to help improve educational opportunities for the people of Guam; and WHEREAS, Dr. Quitugua served the people of Guam in an exemplary manner for nearly half a century as a respected educator, an elected official, a lifelong Democrat, and a community leader who always went out of his way to provide wise counsel, invaluable advice, and heartfelt assistance which had a positive effect on the lives of thousands of our people; and

6 WHEREAS, all public servants understand that their commitment to the 7 community is a lifelong legacy reflected in the quality of life of our people, and the 8 legacy of the late Honorable Dr. Franklin J.A. Quitugua is one of a humble servant 9 who possessed the steadfast desire and dedication to education, in order to improve 10 the lives and opportunities of every individual who called Guam home; and

WHEREAS, the legacy of the late Honorable Dr. Franklin J.A. Quitugua continues to live on in the hearts of his children, grandchildren, siblings, and other members of his family who, much in the same manner as Dr. Quitugua, continue to provide selfless service to the people and island of Guam; now therefore, be it
