RELATIVE TO ENCOURAGING *I MAGA'LAHEN GUAHAN* TO PURSUE THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY'S INCLUSION OF VIETNAM AND THE PHILIPPINES TO THE CONSOLIDATED NATURAL RESOURCES ACT OF 2008, THE GUAM-CNMI VISA WAIVER PROGRAM AND TO EXPRESS THE PEOPLE OF GUAM'S SUPPORT FOR SUCH.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL TRES NA LIHESLATURAN

2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* recognizes that, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*,
under Public Law 110-229, the Consolidated Natural Resources Act of 2008, has
the authority to petition the US Department of Homeland Security to expand the
Guam-CNMI Visa Waiver Program to include the countries of Vietnam and the
Philippines; and

8 WHEREAS, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further recognizes that Vietnam and 9 the Philippines were not initially included in the original approved countries due to 10 various factors in the Department of Homeland Security's analysis at that time; and 11 WHEREAS, in the approximately eight years since many changes have 12 occurred within these two countries that warrant reconsideration. Namely, the 13 Philippines and Vietnam are regarded as fast rising economies in the global GDP rankings. Both countries show potential for future economic and business growthwhich could be beneficial to Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Philippines and Vietnam have seen, over time, significant
decreases in the visa rejection rates; and

5 WHEREAS, Guam is the far western outpost for the United States and this 6 waiver program could strengthen the national bilateral relationship and the 7 Enhanced Defense Cooperation Agreement as promulgated by President Obama; 8 and

9 WHEREAS, Congresswoman Madeleine Z. Bordallo has worked diligently
10 in support of Guam's economy and addressing the Guam-CNMI visa waiver issue
11 for Vietnam and the Philippines; and now, be it

12 **RESOLVED**, that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam 13 recognize and support the need for a Guam-CNMI visa waiver for the countries of 14 Vietnam and the Philippines and support the Governor in petitioning the 15 Department of Homeland Security to include them in the Guam visa waiver 16 program; and be it further

17 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairman of the Committee on Rules 18 certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof, and that 19 copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Secretary Jeh Johnson, United 20 States Department of Homeland Security; Honorable Madeline Z. Bordallo, Guam 21 Delegate to the US Congress; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I* 22 *Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
