1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I***  
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***  
3           **WHEREAS, the late Edward (Ed) B. Chargualaf was born on November 16,**  
4 **1953; and is the son of Sergio Ramirez Chargualaf and Patricia Babauta Chargualaf of**  
5 ***Afame, Sinajana*, where he grew up with his seven (7) siblings; and**

1           **WHEREAS**, after completing his grade school education at Guam schools, Ed  
2 graduated and received his high school diploma in 1971 from the Guam Vocational-  
3 Technical High School; and he then enlisted in the U.S. Army, serving from 1971 to  
4 1973; and he graduated from the U.S. Army’s Communication Specialist School at  
5 Fort Ord, California, where he acquired skills in management, computer programming  
6 and grant writing and management; and

7           **WHEREAS**, on March 17, 1973, Ed married Shirley Jean Chargualaf of  
8 Hawaii, who survives his passing; and their children are: Edward B. Chargualaf, Jr.;  
9 Ui’lanikuulei S.C. Chargualaf (predeceased); Edmund K.C. Chargualaf and Sherrilyn  
10 M.C. Chargualaf; and are also blessed with seven (7) grandchildren: Kekoa  
11 Fernandez, Makoa Lucero, Hoben Chargualaf, Noa Lucero, Maile Chargualaf, Ka’ui  
12 Lucero and Chloe Chargualaf; and

13           **WHEREAS**, in 1981, Ed began his government of Guam career and served in a  
14 long-time association as a Program Coordinator II for the Government of Guam’s  
15 Division of Youth Development, Department of Youth Affairs, rising steadily in the  
16 ranks until he was named as a Juvenile Justice Specialist in 1990; and

17           **WHEREAS**, in 1994, Ed was named as the Youth Development Administrator  
18 of the Government of Guam’s Division of Youth Development; and

19           **WHEREAS**, in 2004, Ed was named as the Executive Director of the Kualoa-  
20 Heeia Ecumenical Youth (KEY) Project in Kaneohe, Hawaii; and

21           **WHEREAS**, from September 2009 to December 2015, the time of his passing,  
22 Ed served as the Juvenile Justice Specialist for the State of Hawaii relative to Juvenile  
23 Delinquency; and

24           **WHEREAS**, Edward B. Chargualaf received much professional recognition for  
25 his work over the years; and on June 11, 2015, he received the Tony Gobar  
26 Outstanding Juvenile Justice Specialist Award, “for exemplifying leadership through

1 service and for reminding all of us that every child is indeed special,” which was  
2 presented by the Coalition for Juvenile Justice; and

3         **WHEREAS**, Senator Rory J. Respicio, who was the Director of Guam’s  
4 Department of Youth Affairs (DYA) at the same time Edward B. Chargualaf was  
5 DYA’s Youth Development Administrator, shared the following statement: “I will  
6 always remember Ed and his passion for our island’s youth and families. In fact, he  
7 was getting ready to retire at the time I was first appointed to serve as DYA’s  
8 Director. I asked him to continue working for the Department, and was so grateful that  
9 he willingly and without hesitation agreed to stay on-board. He was a driving force  
10 behind DYA's success, and in being awarded as “Department of the Year” for three  
11 (3) consecutive years. Indeed, DYA has a great team, and I truly credit Ed’s  
12 leadership and positive nature for bringing people together to solve problems, and to  
13 ensure that DYA’s focus remained on its core mission. I am also grateful to his wife  
14 Shirley and their family for allowing him to continue his work at DYA until such time  
15 they relocated to Hawaii. May God continue to bless Shirley and their family, and  
16 may Edward B. Chargualaf, our dear friend and colleague, rest in peace”; and

17         **WHEREAS**, Meg Williams, a National Officer of the Coalition for Juvenile  
18 Justice, offered this assessment of Edward B. Chargualaf on his passing: “I have had  
19 the great fortune of working with Ed over the past several years. In my estimation, a  
20 gentler soul could not be found. He not only had a passion for the work he did, serving  
21 the youth of Hawaii, especially those who found themselves involved in the justice  
22 system, he also had a passion for helping all the ‘helpers’ like him. It is now our turn  
23 to say a fond farewell to a wonderful friend”; now therefore, be it

24         **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na*  
25 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people  
26 of Guam, recognize and memorialize the late Edward B. Chargualaf for his many

1 notable achievements and for faithfully serving the people of Guam, Hawaii and the  
2 rest of the nation, and particularly for his service to the youth of Guam and Hawaii;  
3 and does further extend sincere and humble condolences to his family on his passing;  
4 and be it further

5 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules  
6 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of  
7 the same be thereafter transmitted to the late Edward B. Chargualaf's wife, Shirley

9 *Guåhan*.
