3 **WHEREAS,** Master Sergeant Timothy J. Anderson began his career in the
4 United States Air Force in December 1994 as an Airman Basic; and from December

1 1994 to January 1995, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson attended and graduated from Basic
2 Military Training, 323rd Training Squadron at Lackland Air Force Base in Texas; and

3 **WHEREAS**, from January to March 1995, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson attended
4 and graduated from Munitions Systems Technical School, 363rd Training Squadron at
5 Sheppard Air Force Base in Texas; and

6 **WHEREAS**, from April 1995 to April 1996, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson served
7 as a Missile Maintenance Crew Member of the 8th Maintenance Squadron at Kunsan
8 Air Base in South Korea; and

9 **WHEREAS**, it was during this time that MSgt Timothy J. Anderson was
10 promoted to the rank of Airman on June 8, 1995; and on April 8, 1996, he was
11 promoted to Airman First Class; and also in April 1996, MSgt Anderson served as an
12 AGM-142 Crew Member of the 2nd Munitions Squadron at Barksdale Air Force Base
13 in Louisiana; and

14 **WHEREAS**, in August 1997, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson's next assignment
15 took him back to Kunsan Air Base in South Korea, where he served as a Conventional
16 Maintenance Crew Member of the 8th Maintenance Squad; and

17 **WHEREAS**, on December 8, 1997, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson was promoted
18 to the rank of Senior Airman; and

19 **WHEREAS**, after serving for a year at Kunsan Air Base, MSgt Timothy J.
20 Anderson's next assignment brought him to Guam in August 1998, where he began
21 serving as a Flight Training Manager for the 36th Maintenance Squadron at Andersen
22 Air Force Base, Guam; and

23 **WHEREAS**, during the year 2000, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson graduated from
24 Airman Leadership School at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam; and on February 1,
25 2001, he was promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant; and

1 **WHEREAS**, in February 2001, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson's next assignment
2 was serving as a Line Delivery Crew Chief of the 57th Equipment Maintenance
3 Squadron at Nellis Air Force Base in Nevada; and

4 **WHEREAS**, in March 2003, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson was assigned to the
5 8th Maintenance Squadron at Kunsan Air Base, South Korea, where he was a Quality
6 Assurance Evaluator; and

7 **WHEREAS**, in March 2004, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson's next assignment
8 took him to Mildenhall, England, where he served with the 352nd Maintenance
9 Squadron as a Senior Weapons Systems Coordinator; and

10 **WHEREAS**, on March 1, 2006, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson was promoted to
11 Technical Sergeant; and in June 2006, his next assignment was serving as the
12 Weapons Safety Manager, 33rd FW, at Eglin Air Force Base in Florida; and

13 **WHEREAS**, during the year 2006, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson graduated from
14 the Non-Commissioned Officer Academy at Tyndall Air Force Base in Florida; and

15 **WHEREAS**, during the year 2007, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson graduated at the
16 Top of the Class in the Weapons Safety Course at Medina Air Force Base in Texas;
17 and

18 **WHEREAS**, during the year 2008, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson had attended
19 Community College of the Air Force at Maxwell Air Force Base in Alabama; and

20 **WHEREAS**, on March 1, 2011, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson was promoted to
21 the rank of Master Sergeant; and in April 2011, he was given his final assignment
22 serving as a Weapons Safety Superintendent of the 36th WG at Andersen Air Force
23 Base, Guam, where his responsibilities included being aware of any issues affecting
24 the safety of explosives operations throughout the base and on the flight line; and

25 **WHEREAS**, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson has received numerous major awards
26 and decorations, including: the Meritorious Service Medal; the Air Force

1 Commendation Medal, with Three (3) Oak Leaf Clusters; the Joint Service
2 Achievement Medal; the Air Force Achievement Medal with One (1) Oak Leaf
3 Cluster; the Army Achievement Medal; the Joint Meritorious Unit Award; the
4 Meritorious Unit Award; the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award with Valor Device

6 Air Force Good Conduct Medal with Six (6) Oak Leaf Clusters; the National Defense
7 Service Medal with One (1) Oak Leaf Cluster; the Armed Forces Expeditionary
8 Medal; the Iraq Campaign Medal; the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal;
9 the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal; the Korean Defense Service Medal; the
10 Air Force Overseas Ribbon Short Tour with Three (3) Oak Leaf Clusters; the Air
11 Force Overseas Ribbon Long Tour; the Air Force Expeditionary Service Ribbon with
12 Gold Border; the Air Force Longevity Service with Four (4) Oak Leaf Clusters; the
13 USAF NCO PME Graduate Ribbon with One (1) Oak Leaf Cluster; the Small Arms
14 Expert Marksmanship Ribbon with One (1) Oak Leaf Cluster; and the Air Force
15 Training Ribbon; and

16 **WHEREAS**, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson has been stationed at nine (9) U.S. Air
17 Force bases around the world; and he has participated in numerous wartime
18 contingency and joint staff directed operations to include Southern Watch, Iraqi
19 Freedom, and Inherent Resolve, and

20 **WHEREAS**, MSgt Timothy J. Anderson has served this island and the country
21 proudly with twenty-one (21) years of service, and will begin this new chapter of his
22 life; now therefore, be it

24 on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize, commend and congratulate Master

26 years of service to the United States Air Force, and extend *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os*


1 *Ma'åse'* to him for his dedication, selfless service and sacrifices to the people of Guam
