WHEREAS, Dr. Ramel A. Carlos is Board Certified in Neurology, with Special
Qualification in Child Neurology and an Adult and Pediatric Neurology private

1 practitioner on Guam. Dr. Carlos received his Doctorate of Medicine from Far Eastern 2 University and the Institute of Medicine in Manila, Philippines. He possesses Medical 3 Licenses from the Guam Medical Board and North Carolina Medical Board and is an 4 active member of the Guam Medical Association and American Academy of 5 Neurology. Dr. Carlos is a distinguished member of the Neurology community, having been recognized with various awards and honors from the University of 6 Hawaii, John A. Burn's School of Medicine, Wake Forest University Baptist Medical 7 8 Center, American Epilepsy Society, Headache World Congress 2000, American 9 Headache Society and World Congress of Movement Disorders. He is married to Dr. 10 Cecile T. Carlos and is the son of Dr. Ruben Carlos and Mrs. Angelina Carlos from 11 Montalban, Rizal, Philippines; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Noel Bien T. Carlos is the only child of Dr. Ramel A. Carlos and Dr. Cecile T. Carlos. Noel is a Neuroscience Major at the University of Southern California, Los Angeles, California. He is a graduate and Salutatorian of Father Duenas Memorial School Class of 2014 and attended St. Anthony Catholic School where he graduated Valedictorian, Class of 2000; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Ramel A. Carlos and his son, Noel Bien T. Carlos have taken
up the charge to bring awareness and insight to the issue of 'Silent Strokes and
Vascular Diseases in Cognitive Impairment on the Island of Guam,' with research,
study and results; and

WHEREAS, both Dr. Carlos and Noel conducted an analysis of 585 patients
from Guam's only Neurology Clinic, 'The Neurology Clinic,' from August 2006 to
December 2014, reviewing their clinical history to determine the history of stroke and
comorbid vascular diseases; and

WHEREAS, evidence suggests that strokes and vascular diseases may be associated with cognitive decline and dementia with lacunar infarctions, silent strokes and leukoaraiosis may also contribute to the development of these deficits. Additionally, current evidences also reveal that vascular diseases such as:
 hypertension, diabetes mellitus, hyperlidemia, heart diseases and stroke can contribute
 significantly to the development of dementia; and

WHEREAS, the clinical history in review was to determine the history of stroke and comorbid vascular diseases, with the review of neuroimaging studies to determine the presence of silent strokes or lacunar infarcts and leukoaraiosis in patients without a history of a clinical stroke; and

8 WHEREAS, in the patients analyzed, history of stroke was identified in 42 9 patients (29%) with memory loss, 19 patients (20%) with Mild Cognitive Impairment 10 (MCI), and 122 patients (35%) with dementia. In the history of silent stroke, identified 11 were 14 patients (10%) with memory loss, 10 patients (10%) with MCI and 41 12 patients (12%) with dementia; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carlos and Noel's study concluded that both silent strokes and leukoaraiosis are found to be more common in patients with Dementia than those with Memory Loss and MCI, possibly due to an increased occurrence of vascular diseases in the group of patients analyzed; and

WHEREAS, in the conclusion of the report, the intent of the data collected was to use toward further research to determine whether patients with silent stroke and leukoaraiosis, and with memory loss and MCI will later develop dementia; and

WHEREAS, the data was also to provide the public with increased information and awareness that proper treatment of various vascular diseases can potentially prevent the development of cerebral infarctions or silent strokes, which both can contribute to cognitive impairment and dementia; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carlos and Noel presented this research study at a Neuroscience Conference in London in March 2016 where they were awarded for the 'Best Research Poster Presentation'; and WHEREAS, this study has provided a fount of information for all the people of Guam and the world, providing insight to the dangers of these diseases and hope for providing treatment and taking precautions when dealing with such; now therefore, be it
