- 1 Director of the National Technical Assistance Center for Children's Mental Health,
- and is an Assistant Professor at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C.; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring works with states, tribes, territories and communities
- 4 to build capacity of mental health services and supports for children and families
- 5 across the nation; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring is an advocate for children's mental health,
- 7 conducting research and policy analysis, conceptualizes and implements training
- 8 programs, and writes technical assistance material; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring provides support as the principal investigator or
- 10 project director for numerous federal and state grants; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring is a nationally and internationally known consultant
- on the expansion of Systems of Care (SOC), Wraparound, financing, health reform,
- outcome management, change management and the implementation of evidence-based
- 14 practices; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring has provided expertise with the Michigan
- 16 Department of Community Health as the Director of Programs for Children with a
- 17 Serious Emotional Disturbance; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring has worked in the child welfare, juvenile justice and
- 19 mental health systems, including community mental health centers, residential
- treatment centers, private outpatient clinics, and nonprofit agencies; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring has actively participated in national organizations
- supporting the development of systems of care for children's mental health and has
- presented at many national and international conferences; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Mr. Wotring is a distinguished author, having published

- informational resources assisting in the expansion of Guam's SOC. Additionally, he
