# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

## MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, a Chamber of Commerce (also referred to in some circles as a board
- 4 of trade) is a form of a business network, e.g., a local organization of businesses whose
- 5 goal is to further the interests of businesses. Business owners in towns and cities form
- 6 these local societies to advocate on behalf of the business community; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Chamber of Commerce is an organization of citizens that invests its time and money to improve the economic, civic, and cultural wellbeing of the local community; and

WHEREAS, the Chamber acts as the spokesperson for the business and professional community and translates the group thinking of its members into action; this is the catalyst of beneficial community supported services throughout the island; and

WHEREAS, the Chamber's mission is to create an environment in which local businesses can grow and prosper, which in turn, improves the economic welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Chamber works toward the increasing development of highways, recreational areas, new industries, and the expansion of existing industries; all of which increase the demand for services. Further, the Chamber provides an expanding market for construction, real estate, and insurance professionals by promoting business and attracting new industries and residents who desire to make Guam their home; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Chamber of Commerce is a non-profit voluntary association of business and professional individuals and firms united in their desire to improve business and build a better social and economic community on Guam; and

WHEREAS, the membership of the Guam Chamber of Commerce is predominantly drawn from the business community, which collectively works for present and future economic development to benefit the residents of Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Chamber of Commerce has assumed the responsibility of strengthening the private sector by proposing solutions to community-wide problems; and in recent years has involved itself largely with the problems and possible solutions of government spending levels, the promotion of a larger United States

1 military presence on Guam, providing seminars to enhance business development and

2 management skills, Guam's inclusion in the tax treaties between the U.S. and foreign

nations, promoting visa waiver programs to enhance tourism growth, and the removal

of federal and local barriers to increase business activity and effectiveness on Guam;

WHEREAS, the preservation of Guam's natural beauty is also important to the Chamber, hence the establishment of the *Na' La' Bonita* Guam program in 2000, which continues to be a contributing factor to community involvement in island beautification; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the Guam Chamber of Commerce activities is unlimited, depending on the needs of the community and the desire and ability of the Chamber to carry them out; and promoting the area's economy and encouraging business and industrial investment, broadening the tax base, and providing employment. To business prospects and newcomers, the Chamber represents the community's "front door;" and

WHEREAS, the Guam Chamber of Commerce has become increasingly involved in macro-economic issues touching on education, human relations, environmental, cultural and governmental concerns in which these issues have caused the Guam Chamber of Commerce to become a viable force in seeking solutions to some of Guam's social problems; and

WHEREAS, most of the work of the Guam Chamber of Commerce is carried out by Chamber members through a network of committees; a work plan is drafted early in the administrative year, providing the blueprint for the Chamber's work. Volunteers from the Chamber membership are assigned to committees to work towards the accomplishment of the goals in the plan; the standing committees include the Armed Forces Committee, the Guam Young Professionals, the Maritime Affairs Committee,

1 the Retail Merchants Committee, the Small Business Focus & Development

2 Committee, and the Wholesale Merchants Committee; and

WHEREAS, each member of the Guam Chamber of Commerce ascribes to a Code of Ethics, which serves as an inspiration for each member to rise above minimum standards. Through the code, the Chamber proclaims and reaffirms its commitment to the highest ideals of principled free enterprise in the American democratic tradition and in the context of America's outpost in the Pacific Rim; and while each member must find within his conscience his own measure of right and wrong, as a body, the Chamber adopts this code to encourage and exhort its members to the common good, within its purposes, and, when necessary, to judge that conduct which is unbecoming a member of this Chamber; and

WHEREAS, each year at its annual gala, the Guam Chamber of Commerce celebrates its anniversary; as well as recognizes member anniversary celebrants and the induction of Laureates into the Guam Business Hall of Fame. This year's recipient of the 2016 Individual Laureate Award is Mr. Philip J. Flores, and 2016 Business Laureate Award being Calvo Enterprises, Inc., both of which will be admitted into the Guam Business Hall of Fame, with the induction taking place during the Guam Chamber's 92<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary Celebration; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Chamber of Commerce remains strong because of its extensive membership, united in its goals of advancing the general welfare and prosperity of Guam, while being guided by its Code of Ethics; now therefore, be it
