- WHEREAS, the late Don P. Sabang was born on December 16, 1966 and is the
- 4 son of Mr. and Mrs. †Pedro Sabang and Tertong Sabang; Don is survived by his wife
- 5 Daphne C. Sabang and son Derek Uebbing; and

- WHEREAS, Don will be missed by his twin sisters: Frances Sabang and Annie
- 2 Estrada; brothers and their spouses: William and Rose Sabang, †Bengalang and Mulun
- 3 Sabang, †Ronnie Sabang, and Robert and Maggie Sabang; and
- 4 WHEREAS, in 1985, Don graduated from George Washington High School,
- 5 Guam. In 1990, he continued his education at the University of Guam, where he
- 6 earned a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice and subsequently a Master's degree in
- 7 Guidance Counseling; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Don was an exceptional supervisor and mentor with the Substance
- 9 Abuse Prevention & Treatment (SAPT) Program and with the New Beginnings
- 10 Program Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC); and
- WHEREAS, before Don became a supervisor, he continued to work in patient
- care as well as concurrently manage the SAPT Block Grant. After he was promoted as
- supervisor with the New Beginnings Program, Don reached many milestones in the
- service of substance abuse treatment for the community, including managing the
- 15 Federal SAPT Block Grant, and from 2009 and 2010, chairing the GBHWC Policy
- 16 and Procedure Committee where he developed Policies and Procedures for the
- 17 GBHWC; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Don developed and managed the Recovery Oriented Systems of
- 19 Care (ROSC) Program and grant, and he solidified the partnership with the
- 20 Department of Correction's Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) Program.
- 21 As a result of Don's efforts, there is now a fulltime Social Worker for the RSAT
- 22 Program and stipend-paid Peer Specialists—positions for those in recovery who
- 23 provide valuable mentorship and recovery coaching; and
- WHEREAS, Don was instrumental in the development of the partnership with
- 25 non-governmental organizations: Salvation Army-Lighthouse Recovery Center; Oasis
- 26 Empowerment Center; and, Sanctuary Incorporated, all of which the GBHWC

currently has contracts with in the community to provide outpatient and residential substance abuse treatment; and

WHEREAS, Don developed the Community Substance Abuse Development and Planning Committee, which is made up of substance abuse treatment providers who discuss treatment needs and concerns and develop strategies to address gaps in service. Under Don's leadership, the Committee has improved the referral system; and WHEREAS, in the Pacific Behavioral Health Collaborative Counsel, Don was the Administrator of the Substance Abuse Certification review board, during which time he prepared candidates interested in becoming certified as Substance Abuse Counselors, Prevention Specialists, and Peer Specialists for the tests available through the International Certification & Reciprocity Consortium (IC & RC). The candidates are from Guam and other Pacific jurisdictions such as Palau, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, the Federated States of Micronesia, American Samoa, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands; and

WHEREAS, Don was instrumental in bringing evidence-based treatment programs to Guam, such as the Matrix Model (New Beginnings is a certified Matrix Institute); the Driving with Care Program for DUI offenders; and, the Dual Diagnosis Recovery Program for patients with occurring disorders; and

WHEREAS, Don also solidified the partnership with the Judiciary of Guam, and he continued to work closely with judges and probation office supervisors at the Superior Court of Guam. Under Don's leadership, the program has grown and flourished. With his guidance, the staff continues to provide professional and compassionate service; and

WHEREAS, Don's employment history with GBHWC was a great success. On December 31, 1998, he started out as a Chemical Dependency Treatment Specialist II. On January 1, 2001, Don was promoted to Chemical Dependency Treatment

1 Specialist III. On February 2, 2007 to February 28, 2007, he was appointed as Acting

2 Drug and Alcohol Supervisor. From January 3, 2003 to November 21, 2009, he

received five (5) "Outstanding Performance Evaluations." On May 22, 2008, he was

promoted as the Substance Abuse Program Supervisor; and

WHEREAS, Don was a humble man filled with richness, compassion, and faith, who always gave up his time to help others in need. He dedicated his life as a pastor to the Guam Bible Fellowship Church from 1995 until his passing on Friday, April 22, 2016 at the age of 49. He will be greatly missed by his numerous aunts, uncles, nieces and nephews, as well as his GBHWC work family and volunteers, his beloved flock at Guam Bible Fellowship Church, and his many friends and relatives; now therefore, be it
