- 3 WHEREAS, Silvina Taumomoa was born on February 6, 1939, to Mr. and
- Mrs. Pedro and Juana Charfauros Cruz from the village of Agat, Guam. She is 4
- 5 married to Mr. Suckling Taumomoa; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Taumomoa is fondly known as "Mrs. T." Her life story is one of strength and perseverance that began as a young woman when she helped raise her younger siblings after losing their father during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. T. earned her Bachelor of Arts in literature and theology in 1962 from Mount Mary University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In 1970, she received her Master of Arts in Secondary Education from the University of Guam, specializing in reading and language arts; and

WHEREAS, as a young woman, Mrs. T. entered the religious life as a nun and was assigned to the Catholic Church on the island of Rota. It was during her service with the Rota Ministry where she was intimately involved in critical issues of the time, including the future political status of the Mariana Islands. As a proponent of the history of the Mariana Islands and indigenous *Chamorro* culture, and an advocate for the integration of people and cultures, Mrs. T. was met with resistance by those advocating for other political status options such as independence, or free association with the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, citing her abilities to lead and guide those with indigenous issues regarding their cultures, Archbishop Felixberto Flores assigned Mrs. T. to participate in the Pacific Conference of Churches in Papua New Guinea. The conference served as an appropriate forum at the time for communities across the Pacific Ocean struggling with cultural identity, integration, and preservation; and

WHEREAS, after embracing and serving a life in the religious order, her work as an authority on cultural matters led Mrs. T. to meeting her love and partner in life, Mr. Taumomoa, a chaplain, and one of the first in his profession in Papua, New Guinea; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. T. began her teaching career in 1962 at San Vicente Catholic School in *Barrigada*, Guam. She then pursued teaching opportunities elsewhere

including Mt. Carmel Catholic School in Agat, Guam, from 1965-1970; Rota Public

2 School System from 1970-1971; and later at Notre Dame High School in Talofofo,

3 Guam, from 1971-1974. Before departing her home island for Papua New Guinea,

Mrs. T. was employed as an English instructor at the University of Guam; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. T. is known among her colleagues to be a very kind and generous individual, who donates so much of her time and effort for the benefit of countless children and their families on Guam and in other Pacific communities; and

WHEREAS, the impact Mrs. T. has had upon the thousands of students is paramount. She, in one way or another, taught, helped, advised, counseled, and supported so many, and her compassion for others can be seen through the success stories of her former students who are actively engaged in their respective communities as teachers, police officers, soldiers, managers, and countless other professions; and

WHEREAS, in her more than fifty (50) years of service as an educator, Mrs. T. helped to inspire generations of families on Guam and in other Pacific communities to believe in the combined power of education and hard work. It is without question that she has helped to shape their future—and the future of their respective islands; and now, therefore, be it
