## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI

- TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- WHEREAS, one of the principles established in *Miranda v. Arizona* is a person's
- 4 right to an attorney, and for the last forty (40) years, Guam's Public Defender Service
- 5 Corporation (PDSC) has dedicated itself to providing legal aid and assistance to those unable
- 6 to afford private counsel; and

WHEREAS, the concept of free legal assistance in Guam was first seen in the Judicare Program, under to the Department of Public Health and Social Services. The program was created in 1968 after the landmark case *Gideon v. Wainwright*, in which the U.S. Supreme Court required states to provide counsel to indigent defendants in criminal cases; and

**WHEREAS,** in 1975, the PDSC was officially established by Public Law 13-51, which created an autonomous corporation whose director was accountable to a Board of Trustees from different branches of the government; and

WHEREAS, since its inception, the PDSC has evolved into a criminal defense team of fifteen (15) attorneys and support staff of thirty-five (35) professionals. Attorney Stephen P. Hattori was recently named the PDSC's Executive Director, and he is the first *Chamorro* to serve in this position; and

WHEREAS, although best known for defending indigent adults accused of felony and misdemeanor criminal violations, the work of the PDSC also extends to representing juveniles who have committed acts that would be criminal if they were adults, helping those in need of guardian ad litem assistance, and in limited cases, to non-criminal matters such as probate; and

WHEREAS, as the PDSC has matured as an organization, and it has expanded its services to meet the needs of the island's criminal justice system. In 2004, a satellite office was created, the Alternate Public Defender (APD)—charged with representing indigent criminal defendants in cases where the PDSC has a conflict of interest. The APD Office consists of six (6) attorneys and (6) support staff, and is currently led by Managing Attorney Ana Maria Gayle; and

WHEREAS, in representing defendants who cannot afford to hire a private attorney, the PDSC and the APD ardently advocate for all persons accused of crime, regardless of their ability to pay. The U.S. Constitution guarantees the right to counsel as an essential component of a fair and impartial criminal justice system. Over the last forty (40) years, the

PDSC has played a key role in ensuring that "justice for all" is not merely an expression, but that it is truly the way our justice system operates in Guam; and

WHEREAS, the attorneys with the PDSC are devoted to fulfilling the organization's mission by ensuring that each person accused of a crime is treated equally and fairly by the court system. Despite overwhelming caseloads, limited resources, an understaffed office, or overly aggressive prosecutors, each day PDSC attorneys work diligently to represent the poor in order to keep *Gideon's* promise alive; now therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, commend and congratulate Guam Public Defender Service Corporation, on being distinguished as the recipient of the "2016 Hustisia Award"; and to further extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to its attorneys and staff for their commitment in dedicating their service and support of our island community and to Guam's justice system on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam; and be it further
