#### 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAL TRES NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin was born on May 29, 1944; and he 3 was called to his eternal reward on February 13, 2015, at the age of seventy (70); and 4 5 WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin is the son of *†*Candido Sanchez

San Agustin and †Maria Taitano San Agustin; and 6

WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin fell in love, and on May 4, 1968,
 he married Lourdes Aguon San Agustin, his wife of forty-six (46) years; and

WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin and Lourdes Aguon San Agustin
were blessed with a son, JJ Albert San Agustin, who is married to Corrine Baza San
Agustin; and

6 WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin's professional career spanned more 7 than forty-four (44) years in both the private sector and with the government of Guam, 8 beginning with his position as a Teacher IV of the Guam Department of Education, 9 where he served from August 1967 to June 1969. He then transferred to the position 10 of School Program Consultant, Federal Programs ESEA I, IV, VII, serving from July 11 1970 to August 1971; and

WHEREAS, from September 1971 to November 1972, the late Albert T. San Agustin held the position of Deputy Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research (BBMR), Federal Programs Clearinghouse; and he then served as the Deputy Director of Education, from November 1972 to April 1974; and

WHEREAS, a year later, the late Albert T. San Agustin became an Executive
Assistant to the Governor, from August 1975 to July 1976, and then transferred back
to the Department of Education, where he became the Director of Education, serving
from August 1976 to April 1977; and

WHEREAS, in June of 1977, the late Albert T. San Agustin took on the position of Administrator of the Guam Health Planning Agency, where he remained until December 1978; and

WHEREAS, from January 1979 to 1981, the late Albert T. San Agustin worked in the private sector, and took on the position of Regional Executive Director with Family Health Planning (FHP); and he served as the Executive Director of the Pacific Postsecondary Education Council, from 1981 to 1982; and WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin then served as the Administrator of
 the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) - Rehab Facilities for six (6) years,
 from 1983 to 1989; and then was the Administrator for DVR overall, from 2000 to
 2011; and

5 WHEREAS, the part-time work experiences of the late Albert T. San Agustin 6 included: GED/Adult Basic Education Instructor; Upward Bound Counselor; Central 7 Texas College Instructor (Naval Apprenticeship Program); Guam Community College Instructor; University of Guam Instructor; University of Guam-Alumni Relations 8 9 Coordinator; Graduate Assistant - Dale Carnegie Institute; Graduate Assistant -University of Minnesota; American International University President-Planner; 10 Defensive Driving Education Instructor; Head Start Program Coordinator-Teacher; 11 Academy of Our Lady of Guam Instructor; and Management Instructor for the 12 Department of Administration; and 13

14 WHEREAS, the teaching experiences of the late Albert T. San Agustin 15 include: Teacher VI, 1967 to 1970 and 1974 to 1975; Teacher of Civics and American Government - Academy of Our Lady of Guam in 1967; Head Start Teacher with the 16 17 College of Guam in the summer of 1966; Central Texas College Naval Apprentice classes for two (2) years; GED Instructor - evening classes, for two (2) years; teaching 18 Business Organization and Human Relations at the Guam Community College (GCC) 19 20 for two (2) semesters; Instructor for Special Education and Supervised Teacher Interns 21 in the schools at the University of Guam (UOG) for two (2) semesters; Instructor for Report Writing, Human Relations, Customer Service, and Supervision for IT&E for 22 23 two (2) years; Leadership Instructor for all government of Guam supervisors for one (1) year; Instructor for American Education for the American International University 24 for four (4) semesters; and he conducted workshops in Chuuk State for School 25 Principals; and 26

WHEREAS, in concert with the University of Minnesota, the late Albert T. 1 San Agustin participated in a unique Doctoral Program that was designed to prepare 2 for the position of School Superintendent; and where he completed Doctoral Courses 3 that would have met the challenges of the School Superintendent as follows: 4 Foundations-Educational Administration: Implications-Educational 5 Legal Administration; School Community Relations; Humanism in School Administration; 6 Junior High School; Principles of Secondary School Curriculum; Community 7 8 Schools; Elementary School Principals; Secondary School Curriculum; Problems in Educational Administration; Social Organizations; Social-Psychology; Formal 9 10 Organizations; Research Theories-Educational Administration: Ouantitative 11 Analysis/Foundations; Comparative Philosophies of Education; and Thesis Research; 12 and

WHEREAS, the impressive educational background of the late Albert T. San Agustin include earning a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Science/Education in 1967; earning a Master's Degree in Secondary School Administration/Curriculum in 1970; and he was a Ph.D. candidate having completed Ph.D. Educational Leadership course work plus preliminary examination in 1975; and

WHEREAS, other civic and government experiences of the late Albert T. San
Agustin include being elected to the Guam Board of Education, serving as a Member
and Chairman from 1980 to 1982; Secretary of the Young Men's League of Guam in
1966; President of HITA Teachers Union; President and Co-founder of the Guam
Nurserymen's Association; Educational Leadership Consultant for the Chuuk
Department of Education; and Talk Show Host for Access Radio K-57; and

WHEREAS, before his passing, the late Albert T. San Agustin was reelected to
 serve on the Guam Education Board in the General Election held on November 4,
 2014; and

1 WHEREAS, the late Albert T. San Agustin will always be fondly remembered 2 for his hard work, dedication, and selfless efforts; and a humble and caring heart for 3 the well being of the family he loved and the community he so devotedly served; now 4 therefore, be it
