- WHEREAS, Lieutenant Jonathan Douglas Wildi is married to Evelyn Wildi, a
- 4 new mother, who has a bachelor's degree in nursing and a background in clinical

1 research; and together they have a daughter, Stella, who was born at the U.S. Naval

2 Hospital Guam; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi attended the Oregon Health and Science University in Portland, Oregon, in 2006. He was a member of the Junior Alpha Omega, and an Alpha member; and he received a scholarship through the U.S. Navy branch of the Health Professions Scholarship Program, where in June 2010 had his anticipated M.D. degree; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi is a member of the Oregon Medical Association; and he was selected as the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) year Student Trustee, and surveyed third (3<sup>rd</sup>) year medical students regarding debt and the possible impact of Senate Bill 12, which would provide tax rebates to physicians who served in underserved areas of Oregon, a project featured in the Portland Physician Scribe. He served twice on the Reference Committee, which prepares floor discussions for formal motions; and he attended and is a voting delegate in all but one (1) meeting, and had organized medical student recruiting events; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi was a Class Senator in which he assisted in allocating funds to classmates utilizing parliamentary procedures; and he served as a Senate President during his second (2<sup>nd</sup>) year, and created a system for students to request funds directly from the Dean's Office; and he led in the revision of the Sage Handbook for the Class of 2011; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi is also a member of the American Medical Association, the American College of Physicians, and the American Academy of Family Physicians; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi organized primary data, created tables, and did a Phase 1 study of docetaxel and bexaotene. Chemotherapy, 2008; 54(@):125-30, and he wrote an article with the supervision of Dr. Govindan labeled Wildi JD, Baggstrom

- 1 MQ, Suresh R et al; and he was also part of Phase 1 and the pharmacokinetic study of
- 2 weekly docosahexaenoic acid-paclitaxel, taxoprexin, in resistant solid tumor
- 3 malignancies. Cancer Chermother Pharmacol, 2009;63(3):451-8; and he was a
- 4 Researcher at the Mind Brain Institute in the summer of 2003-2004 in Baltimore,
- 5 Maryland; and
- 6 WHEREAS, in June of 2005 through July of 2006, Lieutenant Wildi worked as
- 7 a Clinical Research Associate at the Washington University. While serving there he
- 8 consented patients, assessed patient toxicities, scheduled treatment, filled orders, and
- 9 completed data. He gained experience in pharmaceutical, cooperative group, and
- 10 institutionally run trails; and
- WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi did his Residency in Family Medicine at the
- 12 U.S. Naval Hospital, Bremerton in July of 2010 until June of 2013; and he served as
- 13 Chief Resident in his final year; and
- WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi has distinguished himself through exceptional
- 15 meritorious service while serving as a Family Physician and Department Head at the
- Branch Medical Clinic of the U.S. Naval Hospital, Guam from July 2013 until July of
- 17 2016; and the U.S. Naval Hospital was his first duty station. During his time here, he
- displayed leadership and clinical skills that greatly contributed to the overall success
- 19 of the Command's mission; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi managed twenty-one (21) staff members as
- 21 Department Head of a remote, high-volume and high acuity outpatient clinic, with an
- annual throughput of approximately eight thousand (8,000) outpatient encounters and
- 23 eight thousand (8,000) telephone consultants. He managed multiple Medical
- 24 Homeport business metrics, including HEDIS composite score, access to care,
- 25 decreased Emergency Department utilization, and provider continuity; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi maximized the utilization of the Branch Medical Clinic at the command; and the Branch Medical Clinic encounters increased by eight and a half percent (8.5%) in the two (2) years he served as Department Head when compared to the year prior to his leadership promotion; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi thrived as a full spectrum Family Physician in a challenging remote OCONUS billet. The breadth of care included delivering over fifty (50) newborns, managing over two hundred (200) patients on the inpatient medicine service, and managing a challenging outpatient panel with over six thousand (6000) total visits. He took ownership of his patients through preforming procedures, to include IUD/Nexplanon insertion, corticosteroid injections of medium/large joints, and skin biopsies; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi served as impromptu Officer in Charge of Building 6 in which the Branch Medical Clinic resides, coordinating the operations of Family Medicine, Optometry, Preventive Medicine, Radiology, and Laboratory; and facilitating a half million dollars of "Beautification Projects" for these departments; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi executed a department-wide increase in cervical cancer screening from seventy-eight percent (78%) to eighty-three percent (83%) in over six (6) months, which improved U.S. Naval Hospital Guam's ranking to the (90<sup>th</sup>) percentile in Navy Medicine; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi designed and implemented a Nurse-run Hypertension Clinic, an Upper Respiratory Tract Infection Triage Clinic, and a Urinary Tract Infection/Vaginitis Triage Clinic, that resulted in an estimated increased provider appointment availability of ten percent (10%), with increased utility and benefit during times of limited access, namely PCS season; and

WHEREAS, in conjunction with the Family Medicine Department, Lieutenant Wildi implemented a surrogate PCM infrastructure for non-enrolled patients in the Branch Medical Clinic, promoting quality care and continuity of care and an estimated cost avoidance of Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$580,000) in purchased healthcare costs throughout the Family Medicine Departments, totaling five thousand eight hundred (5,800) encounters. He maximized resources by coordinating with the laboratory to convert the BMC Lab into a Phlebotomy Center that was subsequently staffed by BMC corpsmen, resulting in One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) in annual future savings. He introduced critical point of care testing to Branch Medical Clinic, including microscopy, urinalysis, and rapid flu; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi has also exemplified a commitment to being a leader within the Command. He served as the Independent Duty Corpsman Program Director, overseeing the training and patient care of ten (10) IDCs. He provided annual updates to the ESC three (3) times, and he advanced the program through teaching opportunities with the ER, Dermatology, Orthopedics, General Surgery, and Urology Departments; and successfully passed the 2016 MEDIG inspection. He modernized the IDC formulary in coordination with the Pharmacy Department; and assisted the Command in a successful brief to Rear Admiral Gillingham in 2016. He personally oversaw the development of three (3) IDCs as Physician Supervisor, including one (1) IDC that was newly minted from IDC school; and he was able to nominate one (1) IDC for "IDC of the Year"; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi incorporated the Physical Exams Department into the Branch Medical Clinic using Family Medicine personnel, ensuring that the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam continued to function as a Military Entrance Processing Station, and provide readiness services to U.S. Naval Hospital Guam and tenant

1 commands, resulting in ninety-six percent (96%) and ninety percent (90%) readiness,

2 respectively; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi successfully added Nexplanon contraceptive to the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam formulary. He served as the Family Medicine representative for the Essentris inpatient medical record and ensured the smooth transition to an upgraded system in 2015. He excelled as the Branch Medical Clinic ACFL for one and a half (1.5) years, leading departmental PT once per week during that time and managing one (1) officer on FEP; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi empowered the growth and success of his peers while sharing the Branch Medical Clinic manpower. He is a team player and model officer in his service to the U.S. Navy. As an IDC Program Director, he assisted tenant commands through resource sharing of IDCs whey they were in need, resulting in four (4) TAD opportunities. He also cared for the U.S.S. Frank Cable shore duty sailors when the ship was underway and coordinated the transition of care of the Frank Cable pregnancies from the Obstetric Department to the Branch Medical Clinic. He personally supervised the development of the newly graduated Nurse Practitioner, ensuring appropriate levels of responsibility and proper credentialing at U.S. Naval Hospital Guam. He regularly provided clinical guidance to the IDCs and two (2) midlevel providers at the Branch Medical Clinic; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Wildi has also volunteered his time serving in numerous organizations, both stateside and on Guam, to include: Arts-As-Healing in Saint Louis, Mouissori; Member of Habitat for Humanity; and ER Volunteer at Saint Joseph's Hospital, and secretarial work with Shepard's Clinic all in Baltimore, Maryland. He is a member of the Guam Triathlon Federation, and he won the Guam National Triathlon in 2015. He is a member of the Guam Water Polo Club and represented Guam in a Hong Kong Polo Tournament in August of 2015; and

1 WHEREAS, among the many interests and activities that Lieutenant Wildi 2 enjoyed during his time on the island, he will miss the southern end of the island the 3 most, to include spearfishing and making parrot fish *kelaguen*; now therefore, be it 4 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Tres Na 5 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people 6 of Guam, recognize and commend Lieutenant Jonathan D.
