

I MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN 2016 (SECOND) REGULAR SESSION

RELATIVE TO REGISTERING THE SUPPORT OF MINA TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN FOR EXECUTIVE ORDER 2016-5 ISSUED BY GOVERNOR EDDIE BAZA CALVO, AND CONVEYING THAT THE RULE OF LAW MUST REMAIN AT THE CORE OF THE CALVO ADMINISTRATION'S EFFORTS TO DEPORT FOREIGN CRIMINALS FROM GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'

- 2 TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- WHEREAS, the existing Compacts of Free Association (COFA) provide
- 4 for the admission of non-immigrant aliens for education and employment
- 5 purposes; and
- WHEREAS, these same Compacts of Free Association provided for the
- 7 removal and deportation of COFA citizens who are not abiding by the laws of
- 8 Guam and the United States; and
- 9 WHEREAS, federal statutes governing the Compacts of Free Association
- 10 further established the legal basis for the deportation of COFA citizens who engage
- 11 in criminal activity; and

WHEREAS, the United States Government has consistently neglected to adequately enforce the provisions of the Compacts of Free Association and governing federal statutes and unfortunately have not taken the necessary steps for the removal and deportation of those foreign criminals who are engaging in criminal activity, and who are therefore in violation of the Compacts of Free Association, the laws of Guam and the United States; and WHEREAS, Public Law 32-49, "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §80.50 TO ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 80, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING A 'THREE STRIKES' PROVISION FOR HABITUAL OFFENDERS OF SERIOUS CRIMES" authored by Senator Brant McCreadie was signed into law on July 5, 2013, included in this law is a provision authored by Senator Rory J. Respicio which mandates that requires "[U]pon conviction of a deportable crime, the Attorney General of Guam (AG) shall immediately notify the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Division of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) of Guam's desire to have the COFA citizen deported, requiring that the AG work closely with the U.S. ICE Division of DHS to ensure all documents related to the conviction and required for deportation are immediately provided to the proper authorities;" and WHEREAS, under the terms of the Compacts of Free Association, citizens of the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands and the

1 Republic of Belau who have entered Guam via the Compact are subject to 2 deportation if convicted of a felony or a crime of moral turpitude. They also are 3 subject to deportation if they are sentenced to one year or more for any crime 4 committed or if they are repeat offenders for Driving Under the Influence of 5 Alcohol statutes; and WHEREAS, Governor Calvo has recently issued Executive Order 2016-5 6 7 invoking his authority under the Organic Act of Guam to take the necessary steps 8 to deport a convicted felon to their country of origin; now therefore be it 9 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina Trentai Tres Na Lihelaturan Guahan* does hereby 10 register its full support for the actions of I Maga'Lahen Guahan through his 11 execution of Executive Order 2016-5, and further assert that the Rule of Law must 12 remain at the core of the Government of Guam's efforts to deport foreign criminals 13 from Guam; and be it further 14 RESOLVED, that I Mina Trentai Tres Na Lihelaturan Guahan finds that 15 such a policy to deport ALL foreign criminals, regardless of their country of origin, 16 pursuant to the treaties which allowed them entry into Guam would be in keeping 17 with the spirit of such treaties and furthermore that Executive Order 2016-5

together with Section 2 of P.L. 32-49, clearly embodies the application of the Rule
