Relative to recognizing and honoring the uniformed and civilian personnel of the Guam Department of Corrections (DOC) for their dedication and commitment to fulfilling the essential role of securing the safety of our island and reforming our island's offenders, and paying tribute to these hard working employees as they celebrate the occasion of "Corrections Week 2016" from August 7 to August 13, 2016; and to further extending *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the staff of DOC for their service.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI TRES NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, the devoted and valiant employees of the Department of Corrections
- 4 (DOC) have the responsibility of ensuring the custody and protection of over seven
- 5 hundred (700) inmates and detainees. These highly devoted individuals do more than

1 supervise; they also train, teach, mentor, counsel and treat incarcerated individuals; they

provide hope and guidance; and they work to rebuild lives. Their jobs are demanding and

stressful, yet they respond admirably and reliably day after day; and

WHEREAS, there are one hundred seventy-seven (177) uniformed officers, five (5) parole officers, and eighteen (18) civilian employees serving at DOC who are committed to providing a safe environment at the DOC facilities; and

WHEREAS, there are currently three hundred sixty-four (364) detainees, three hundred seventy-seven (377) inmates, and thirteen (13) off-island inmates within the Department of Corrections; and DOC works diligently to prepare inmates who are nearing their return to the community for successful re-entry. Effective programs are offered to address the diverse needs of the inmate population, which include, but are not limited to, substance abuse treatment, mentoring, life skills training, conflict resolution, and educational classes; and

WHEREAS, while individuals are incarcerated they have the options of pursuing their General Educational Development (GED) certificate, and participating in programs, such as Work Credit, Work Release, and Educational Release Programs, which are created to grant qualified inmates a reduction of their time of incarceration by actively participating in and completing components of these rehabilitation programs; and

WHEREAS, through their Work Credit Program, DOC is able to contribute remarkably to the beautification of our island by arranging and performing lawn maintenance at various areas, such as: the Veteran's Cemetery, the *Harmon* Sports Complex, Government House, the Department of Public Health & Social Services, and at several public schools and villages, saving money for the government of Guam; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Corrections offers a Vocational Rehabilitation Service, which is divided into sections such as their "Green Valley Farm" in conjunction with the Department of Agriculture, that offers inmates knowledge in tilling and planting, and raising livestock. In return, the produce and livestock they raise are often donated to

the community. Most recently, two (2) pigs were donated to the *Asan* Mayor's office for their festivities; and

WHEREAS, another Vocational Rehabilitation Program section that is offered is the Electrical, Carpentry, Plumbing, and Welding section, where inmates are working hands on, and learning in the process. There is also a Residential Substance and Treatment Program, where inmates are selected based on their conviction and subjected to a six (6) month intense treatment program addressing their substance abuse. The Department is currently working on implementing their "Prison Work Program," in which inmates will be compensated for the work that they do. They are also in the process of collaborating with Guam Animals In Need (GAIN) in possibly starting an "inmate adopt" program with the animals at the shelter; and

WHEREAS, in addition, several staff and inmates recently assisted island officials with the 12th Festival of Pacific Arts (FestPac) in building over ten (10) traditional Chamorro huts and providing security detail for FestPac dignitaries and delegations from participating islands; and

WHEREAS, in the past year and a half, the Department has been working ardently in improving and adhering to the standards of a court order. The decree generated a great deal of support and created a stipulated agreement with Guam Memorial Hospital and a completely renovated medical ward. The completion of the electronic locking system is also ongoing; and

WHEREAS, the Department has several events scheduled throughout "Corrections Week 2016," to include a Memorial Mass, open house tours, troop inspection, a memorial service, and a family picnic; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam give thanks and praise to the many hard working and dedicated individuals in the corrections profession. These men and women put their health, safety, and lives on the line every day to maintain public safety and to reform and

rehabilitate our island's offenders. They have a tremendous responsibility and are owed our island's gratitude; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize and honor the uniformed and civilian personnel of the Guam Department of Corrections (DOC) for their dedication and commitment to fulfilling the essential role of securing the safety of our island's offenders, and pay tribute to these hard working employees as they celebrate the occasion of "Corrections Week 2016" from August 7 to August 13, 2016; and does further extend *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the staff of DOC for its service; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Alberto A. Lamorena V, Acting Director, Department of Corrections; to Colonel Alan P. Borja, DOC Facilities Superintendent; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan*.
