- 3 WHEREAS, the University of Guam Center for Excellence in Developmental
- 4 Disabilities, Education, Research and Services (Guam CEDDERS) established the
- 5 Guam System for Assistive Technology (GSAT) project in 1994, after a three (3) year
- 6 development grant was approved by the U.S. Department of Education; and

WHEREAS, the movement to provide technology related assistance to individuals with disabilities began with the Disabilities Act of 1998, as amended in 1994, 1998 and 2004 (P.L. 100-407 and 103-218); and referred to as the "AT Act of 1998" (P.L. 105-394), which was passed on November 13, 1998; and the "AT ACT of 2004" (P.L. 108-364), which was passed on October 24, 2004, and which provided the much needed funding for the grant; and

WHEREAS, since 2004, the GSAT has annually served an average of three hundred eighty-five (385) individuals through training, and has provided one hundred (100) hours of technical assistance to public and private entities. It reaches an estimated eleven thousand eight hundred (11,800) individuals through public and private agencies, and eighty (80) short term device loans, which saves consumers an average of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty-one Dollars (\$4,821) through its Reutilization Efforts; and it provides around Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) in loan funds to finance assistive technology devices; and Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) to assist individuals with disabilities who want to become self employed; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the "AT Act" is to provide financial assistance to territories and states to undertake activities that assist in maintaining and strengthening a permanent comprehensive statewide program of technology-related assistance for individuals with disabilities of all environments; and

WHEREAS, the Guam System for Assistive Technology (GSAT) Program is administered by the Guam Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, and Services (Guam CEDDERS), and it has developed a strong foundation in the development of a comprehensive state-wide program of technology-related assistance for individuals with disabilities on our island; and in doing so, it has provided sixty-seven (67) short term device loans for the primary purposes of

assisting in decision making, serving as a loaner during device service repair or while waiting for funding to provide accommodation on a short term basis, or conducting training, self-education or other professional development activity; and

WHEREAS, the Guam System for Assistive Technology Advisory Council is comprised of twenty-one (21) proactive and hard working members consisting of various types of individuals within our community, to include, individuals with disabilities, parents, family members who are selected from among their peers, advocacy organizations, non-profit service providers, and government of Guam agency representatives; and

WHEREAS, in FY 2014, the GSAT provided device demonstrations for fifty-eight (58) new individuals; training for one hundred seventy-nine (179) new individuals; provided one hundred (100) hours of technical assistance to public and private entities; and it has reached approximately thirty thousand (30,000) individuals through its public awareness activities; and

WHEREAS, the GSAT provided Four Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$4,998) in low interest financial loans to assist individuals in starting up their new business who had no other access to funding; the GSAT also provided Six Thousand Six Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$6,650) in low interest financial loans for the purchase of assistive devices for individuals who had no other access to funding; and the GSAT's Re-Utilization Program efforts resulted in Five Thousand One Hundred Nine Dollars (\$5,109) in consumer savings; and

WHEREAS, the GSAT conducted three hundred three (303) activities of information dissemination and individual assistance; and it continued the expansion of the AT Device Demonstration and Lending Library by adding twenty (20) new devices; and
